I have not forgotten your note re. Exhibition but re. Invoices I really don't know which would be useful to you. I send you a book wherein I tabulated them with notes so that you may make some sort of choice. Some of the best of them I presented to my old friends such as I gave one to Mauns who wrote to tell me it was probably the oldest thing they possessed. That it framed & hung in their Office I believe. Bourgeois' had one framed in their shop window in the Strand for a year or two.

Darwin's Orders etc I think have one or two of interest left but I have given some to notable scientific men to whom I wrote.

I have a most "heroic" poster-Enema-apparatus more like a fire-engine than that. I am sure will cause much amusement. It was framed in C.O.D. some years back. I have 1st Editions of Hutchinson's & Ph. Journals. The 1840 lot I mean.

Terrible job to get time to look them up but I have it now before me so shall not forget.

I have also an extraordinary old Feeding Bottle & one of the old "draught" bottles like Russia uses even today.
