The Committee for the Commemorative Fete for 1911 has entrusted a special commission, with a view to organising in Castel S. Angelo a series of retrospective exhibits likely to make better known the various forms in which from the Middle Ages to the middle of the last century, life was manifested in Rome and neighbouring towns. But to ensure the success of such an exhibition it is essential that every citizen should contribute because every souvenir, every object, will make a link and in completing some of our exhibits it would be of inestimable value. On the other hand the interest which every citizen certainly has for the success of such exhibits, which will add to the attraction of the fete of 1911 and to the dignity of the capital, encourages us to take the liberty of addressing you, asking for your efficacious assistance. The sections of the Exhibition are as follows:-

(a) Various souvenirs of pure and applied art from the Middle Ages to the middle of the 19th Century, busts, statues, crests, heraldry, capitols, wrought iron, tapestry, materials, furniture, etc.

(b) Roman artists from the 13th to the 16th Century; pictures, frescoes, engravings, drawings and water colours. Cosmati. Epoch of Michael Angelo (sculptures and pictures of the master's pupils and objects having relation to Michael Angelo and his pupils; copies and imitations of Michael Angelo's works.

(c) Special Salon. (room Borgiana, Berniniana & similar ones)

(d) Exhibits of costumes - Robes of magistrates, public officials, soldiers - elegant dresses of men and women - laces, materials, jewellery, bric-a-brac, toilet articles, small furniture, fans, walking sticks, snuff boxes, etc.

(e) Arms. History of fire arms and armory, for attack or defence, fencing weapons for tournaments from the oldest epochs to 1870.

(f) Pharmacy of the 16th Century. Perfumes - surgical instruments - Latial china (history of the Etruscan and Roman epochs in 1800.)

(g) Topography of Rome (pictures, drawings, maps, photography, etc. which are likely to reproduce the town in past centuries, not only in its monuments, but in its most characteristic aspects.

Records of demolished or transformed houses, of fountains and churches. Characteristic records of popular customs, men and original types of people. Souvenirs of carnivals, of tournaments with cows, of the race of the barbarians, processions and fireworks, etc.

(h) Roman numismatics and Roman seals (coins, medals, original seals and impressions from the Middle Ages up to the present time.

(i) Exhibits of foreign life in Rome. Souvenir of celebrated foreigners who have lived in Rome, their studies and works on Rome; portraits of foreign artists reproducing Rome and the country round about.

The sections will be collected together in Castel S. Angelo.

The great variety of the sections gives everyone an opportunity of contributing to the Citizens' Exhibit and the place where it is organised, sheltered from all danger can only but assure the exhibitors of the careful preservation of the articles exhibited, also if they are of great historical or artistic value. On articles exhibited will be indicated the name of the proprietor.

The objects of this Exhibit will be restored when the Exhibition is finished and the Committee has the warranty for the preservation of the articles during the Exhibition; and will also provide the expenses for the transport of the articles to Castel S. Angelo and for their transport to the house of the exhibitor after the Exhibition.

The proposal of the intention to exhibit must be made in writing to the President of the Commission of the Retrospective Art Exhibition in Castel S. Angelo and delegates will go and inspect the proposed articles. The proprietor from whom articles are expected for the Exhibition will have gratuitous admission to Castel S. Angelo for all the duration of the Exhibition during the hours it is open to the public.

There will be a regular receipt given for every object exhibited at the Exhibition.

The Executive Committee for the Commemorative Fete for 1911 count upon the willingness of the citizens and of everyone in the provinces of Rome who can contribute to the success of the Retrospective Exhibition to facilitate the work of the Commission

Programme of Section 6.

Among the various sections of this Retrospective Exhibition of great historical and artistic interest, will, without doubt, be Section VI which will comprise:-

The exhibition of majolica of Central Italy manufacturers from the 13th to the 18th Century.

The principal aim of such an exhibit is to propagate the works of such an artistic branch, essentially Italian, and produced by our great artificers and modest workers of the far middle ages, to the splendour of the Rinascimento, to the 15th Century, still full of force and colour in its beautiful examples, and finally, to the decadence of the 18th Century.

The remains of the historic castle which saw so many artists and protectors of art in the most glorious epoch will gather together with dignity, such precious souvenirs.

The Retrospective Exhibits of the surgical armamentary and pharmaceutical implements, will comprise the most curious instruments, according to usage and epoch, from the beautiful and elegant surgical Graeco-Roman instruments to those rough and heavy ones of the Middle Ages, up to those very fine ones of the Rinascimento which constitute real works of art of the chisel.

There will be beautiful mortars of the 15th Century, of which the chemists of that epoch were so proud, mortars of bronze, of porphyry, of ivory and agate, all the implements in majolica, from the rich ornamental vases of Cafaggiolo, Faenza and Urbino, to the simple monochrome tubes..

Murano will give us its finished works in blown glass, from small jars, small pots, bottles, retorts, carboys, covers for laboratory alembics.

The exhibition of votive gifts for health (Donaria), Etruscan and Roman, which show at what point of realism the potters had reached in the confection of these gifts, with which the prayers of those who prayed and those who had been granted their requests tried to propitiate the divinity.

In a special room there will also be gathered as many articles as it is possible to obtain which have relation to the hygienic art in Rome and which combine their artistic side with that of historical and scientific interest.

The exhibit will comprise the following reconstructions.-  
(1) Pharmacy of the 17th Century with laboratory annexed.  
(2) Barber's shop of the 17th Century (3) Consulting room of the Milanese hermetic and alchemist doctor Giuseppe Francesco Borri, who was a prisoner and practised in the castle.

The Order Committee who will do their best to ensure the success of the Exhibition warmly begs erudites, collectors, museums and moral societies that they will bring their contributions to this historical and artistic manifestation which is calculated to make known more fully the best Italian history for the teaching of the present and the future.

All the articles placed in Section VI will be those which are mentioned in the following classes:

#### CLASS I.

Pictures, Engravings, Inscriptions, Sculptures, Bas-reliefs and casts of medical interest.

(a) Busts in sculpture, portraits in wax and plaster, engraved portraits of distinguished physicians, surgeons, alchemists, chemists and apothecaries (Italian)

(b) Pictures and engravings of Italian hospitals and ancient medical institutions.

(c) Medals and medallions of Italian physicians, surgeons, naturalists and illustrious Italian chemists.

#### CLASS II.

Rare and curious manuscripts referring to medical, chemical and pharmaceutical subjects. Herbaria. Prescriptions and autographs of Italian doctors, ancient diplomas of Italian physicians, surgeons and chemists.

#### CLASS III.

Curiosities of Surgery and Medicine

(a) Chirurgical and dental instruments from the Graeco-Roman epoch up to the 18th Century.

(b) Ancient spectacles

(c) Portable pharmacies

(d) Etruscan and Roman dental prostheses

(e) Aceouchement chairs; old models for obstetrical teaching.

#### CLASS IV.

Votive gifts for health (Donaria), ancient, mediaeval and of the Rinascimento. Ancient and modern amulets. Talismans. Relics of the influence of the astrological period on medicine.

#### CLASS V.

Curiosities of Pharmacy

(a) Scales, weights and measures of all kinds.

**Programma della Sez. VI.**

Tra le diverse Sezioni di questa Mostra Retrospettiva di grande interesse storico ed artistico senza dubbio riuscirà la Sezione VI che comprenderà:

La mostra delle maioliche delle fabbriche dell'Italia centrale dal secolo XIII al secolo XVIII.

Principale scopo di tale mostra è di far meglio conoscere le opere che in tal ramo d'arte, essenzialmente italiana, produssero i nostri grandi artefici ed i nostri modesti operai dal lontano medioevo, allo splendore del Rinascimento, al seicento ancora pieno di forza e di colore in alcuni suoi belli esemplari ed in fine alla decadenza del secolo XVIII. Le sale dello storico Castello, che videro artisti e protettori d'arte nella più gloriosa epoca, accoglieranno degnamente tali preziose memorie.

La Mostra Retrospettiva dell'armamentario chirurgico e della suppellettile farmaceutica comprenderà gli strumenti i più disparati per uso e per epoca, dal bello ed elegante ferro chirurgico Greco-Romano, ai rozzi e pesanti del Medioevo, fino a quelli finissimi del Rinascimento, che costituiscono veri capolavori dell'arte del cesello. Vi saranno i bei mortai del secolo XVI, di cui i farmacisti di allora andavano così fieri, mortai di bronzo, di porfido, d'avorio e di agata, tutta la suppellettile in maiolica dal ricco vaso ornamentale di Cafaggiolo, di Faenza e d'Urbino ai semplici rocchetti monocromi. Murano ci darà tutti i suoi fini lavori in vetro soffiato, dagli alberelli, dai vasetti, dalle bottiglie da armadio, alle storte, ai piatti da cristallizzazione, ai coperchi di alambicco per laboratorio.

L'Esposizione dei doni votivi per salute (*Donaria*) Etruschi e Romani mostrerà bene, fino a qual punto di piccante realismo il figurinaio etrusco e romano fosse arrivato nella confezione di questi manufatti, con i quali i preganti o gli esauditi si propiziavano la divinità.

Verranno inoltre raccolti in una speciale sala quanti più oggetti sarà possibile avere, che abbiano attinenza coll'esercizio dell'arte salutare ed affini in Roma e che uniscano il loro lato artistico a quello d'interesse storico e scientifico.

La mostra comprenderà inoltre le seguenti ricostruzioni : 1° una farmacia del secolo XVII col suo annesso laboratorio; 2° la bottega di un maestro barbiero del secolo XVII; 3° il gabinetto del medico ermetico ed alchimista milanese Giuseppe Francesco Borri, il quale fu prigioniero ed esercitò in Castello.

Il Comitato ordinatore, che porrà ogni cura nella buona riuscita della mostra, fa caldo appello agli eruditi, collezionisti, musei ed enti morali, affinchè vogliano portare il loro largo contributo a questa manifestazione storico-artistica, diretta a far meglio conoscere il passato italiano per ammaestramento del presente e dell'avvenire.

Tutti gli oggetti che troveranno posto nella Sezione VI della mostra sono quelli che si raggruppano nelle seguenti classi.
