THE WELLCOME HISTORICAL MEDICAL MUSEUM.

An International Collection illustrating the History of Medicine and the Allied Sciences.

This Museum was founded by Mr. Henry S. Wellcome last year in connection with the XVIIth International Congress of Medicine, and has now been re-opened as a permanent institution in London.

The collections include historical pictures, statuary, ancient surgical instruments and other objects connected with medicine, surgery and the allied sciences from all parts of the world. Interesting relics of eminent scientists discoverers and men famous in medicine and surgery are exhibited, also a large collection of ancient manuscripts and early printed books on medicine and the sciences.

Models have been re-constructed of old alchemists' laboratories, shops of ancient apothecaries and barber-surgeons, hospital wards of the 17th century and a sick room of the same period.

The object of the Museum is purely scientific and educational and to stimulate interest in the history of medicine.


Dear Sir,
