Dear Mr. Buckler,

Many thanks for your kind letter of the 11th inst. enclosing the cuttings from "The Times". Mr. Hilton Simpson appears to have secured some very interesting things. I met him last year before he went out to North Africa, and am glad to know he has been so successful.

I shall be pleased to keep your collection of Roman surgical instruments in our strong room here in safety until you wish to have them back at the end of June. I have only been able to have models of the principle ones made as we found the expense was so great. It taxed our modeller to the utmost to copy the beautiful workmanship especially of the handles of some of the instruments in your magnificent collection.

Thanks for your note re the netting needles. I knew these implements could not have been used for medical purposes, although it has been frequently asserted that they were a kind of tenaculum. We have a number of them in our Museum that were found with probes

and spatulae, but I should hesitate to label them as instruments of surgery.

Knowing your interest in historical medical matters, I have pleasure in enclosing you a copy of the paper on "Terra Sigillata" that I delivered before the International Congress of Medicine.

Again thanking you for remembering us, and for your kindness in lending us the Roman instruments so long,
