Dentists Instrument - in  
perfect order, excepting that  
having been put aside for  
years the rubber tube is  
stiff -

It was one of the first attempts  
at painless Dentistry & was  
called the "Freezing Process" but  
as they gradually found  
improvements it was laid  
aside - Was used by a Dentist



(I knew) in London between  
1855 & 60 -

Sorry I cannot draw it -  
but you can have it on  
approval by paying carriage

It consists of a glass bottle  
1/3 full of small sponges -  
a long large ~~large~~ tube covered  
with fine netting - a massive  
brass piece with two taps  
& another piece of brass  
on end of tube -

The brass is as new, bright  
and good - Maker "Weiss London"  
In leather box size  $9\frac{3}{4}$ ,  $6\frac{1}{2}$  by 4.  
lined crimson cotton. Velveteen.  
I cannot tell you its value  
as it was so long ago. - but  
the brass alone would have  
made it expensive - Any



fair offer for it taken.

It was used with "Lee". I know & there was a little Pamphlet written about it. No doubt a copy would have had to be put in British Museum when printed -

Sorry I do not know more about it but I was very young at the time 5 or 6 years old & the only thing that interested us children was the "ice" - we used to way-lay our man Charles & beg for a piece as he fetched it from a big Safe in the yard of house.

If you know any Lady American collectors I have a great curiosity probably unique A white country Ribbon & Orange Blossom Wedding Favour, bought in London & worn on the King Edward's Wedding day - Part of



the Royal blue Paper it was  
sold on is still there with  
silver letters describing it  
(now black).

Also a little Metal Medal of  
same day.

Embossed heads. Prince &  
Princess one side, Hymen's  
Torch &c & date & names  
the other.
