Dear Sir,

I hoped to have had the pleasure of a call from you before your return to China, but trust you have had a pleasant visit to England.

With reference to the conversation I had with you, in which you kindly offered to send samples of native drugs from China for investigation, which you thought would be of commercial value, I discussed the matter with Mr. Wellcome, and he tells me he will be most pleased if you would kindly forward him any samples of this kind, together with full particulars, at your convenience. The specimens sent should be of the full plant if possible, including leaves, flowers, and seeds, if possible, with a description of what diseases they are used for. As large a sample as possible in each case is desirable.
