TRAILL'S INDIAN DIARY 1914.

MAHOMEDAN YEAR.

The "Hijra" signifies "departure" or "separation," and refers to the flight of Mahomed from Mecca to Medina, which is said to have taken place on the night of the 12th July, 622 A.D. The Mahomedan era commenced on 16th July, 622 A.D. The year is a lunar one, and consists of 12 months of 30 and 29 days alternately with an intercalary day, added 11 times in 30 years. The year contains an average of 354 days 8 hours 48 minutes, every year therefore begins 10 to 12 days earlier in the season than the preceding one.

Mahomedans and Jews reckon the first day of their months from the first appearance of the new moon.

The Hijra year 1333 commences Nov. 19th, 1914.

FUSLEE YEAR.

Or the Harvest year, from "Fasl" signifying crops. This era was introduced by the Emperor Akbar, and computed from his accession, 1555 A.D. Hijra 963.

The Fuslee year of the Dukkan was introduced in 1638 A.D.

The year 1322 commences Sept. 5th, 1914.

SAMVAT YEAR.

The era of Vikramaditya is reckoned from 57 B.C. and is used in the north of Hindustan and Gujrat.

In 1555 A.D. when Akbar introduced the Fuslee year, the Samvat year, then 1612, was made to correspond with the Hijra 963, and they have gone on concurrently since.

Samvat year 1971 commences March 26th, 1914.

VILAYATI or "UMLY" YEAR.

Used in Orissa, was made to begin 9th Sept., 1555, and coincided with the Shaka year, 1477.

An Astronomical day commences at 12 noon. A civil or ordinary day commences 12 midnight. A Mahomedan or Jewish day commences in the evening. A Hindu ordinary day commences at sunrise. All Time Calculations in Traill's Indian Diary "Calendar" are based on the Hindu ordinary day of 24 hours from sunrise to sunrise, Calcutta Time.

BENGALI YEAR.

(SAN I BENGALI) used in the provinces of Lower Bengal, commenced April, 1556.

The year 1321 commences April 14th, 1914.

SHAKA YEAR.

Or the era of Shalivahana is reckoned from March 78 A.D., and is used in the south of Hindustan.

SHAHUR YEAR.

The era of Maharashtra commenced with the year 743 A.H. on 6th June, 1342 A.D.

PARASHURAMA.

Used in Malayala (Mangalore to Cape Comorin). The 4th Cycle of 1,000 years commenced September, 1825 A.D.

KALIYUG.

This era commenced 3101 B.C.

PARSI YEAR.

The present era commenced 16th June, 632 A.D. (Accession of Vezdijird) almost exactly ten years after the Hijra or Mahomedan year—the year is divided into 12 months of 30 days each and five days "Gathas" added at the end to make up 365 days. The months are not divided into weeks but each day is separately named after a Celestial being supposed to preside over it.

The "Shahanshahi" sect or "Rasamis" form the larger body of the Parsis and begin their year a month later than the "Kadmis" who conform to the Persian usage.

BURMESE YEAR.

Era was established by Puppachanrahan in 639 A.D., which corresponded with the year 1183 of the Burmese Sacred Era. The division of the months accords with the Luni Solar System of the Hindus.

The Dominical or Sunday Letter is the letter of the alphabet used to indicate the incidence of the Sundays in the Ecclesiastical Calendar—thus in 1914 the first Sunday falling on Jan. 4th the letter D (4th letter) will fall opposite the Sundays.

The Golden Number is the number of years elapsed in the Lunar Cycle or period of 19 years, at the end of which period the same aspects of the moon recur within an hour and a half of the same times.

The Epact is a number representing the age of the moon on the first day of the new year.

The Solar Cycle is a period of 28 years, within which the Dominical or Sunday Letters, and those that express the other festivals, &c., return in the same order as before.

The Roman Indiction is a period of 15 years, used by the Romans for the time of taxing their provinces.

The Julian period contains 7980 years (being the Lunar Cycle of 19, the Solar Cycle of 28, and the Roman Indiction of 15 multiplied together). The Julian period is reckoned as having begun 4713 years before our era, so that the year 1914 corresponds with 6627 of that period. It is used in astronomical and chronological calculations throughout the world.

On Sundays and Post Office Holidays, the Post Office is not open for the transaction of business, except for the issue and payment of telegraphic Money Orders and Sale of Postage Stamps, on Thursdays British Postal Orders are sold from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

VALUE-PAYABLE SYSTEM.

Enables the recipients of parcels, packets, etc. to pay for them at the time of receipt of the articles, and the Post Office receives and transmits the money to the senders of such articles.

Registered and unregistered parcels, registered letters, registered and unregistered (but fully prepaid) book packets, newspapers prepaid at newspaper rates, may be transmitted under the system. Legal documents, bonds, policies, promissory notes, railway receipts, bills of lading, or ordinary bills for collection, may also be sent under the system. The sender must declare that the articles are sent in execution of a *bonâ fide* order received by him.

Every article to be transmitted must be presented at the post office accompanied by the prescribed form which bears a certificate that the contents have been sent in execution of a *bonâ fide* order and in which must be filled in the name and address of both addressee and sender and the amount specified for remittance to the sender.

If the article is an unregistered parcel, book packet, or newspaper, the fee on the sum specified for recovery must be prepaid in stamps affixed to the article; no receipt will be given, but the ordinary certificate of posting can be obtained.

for each complete sum of Rs. 25, and 4 Annas for the remainder; provided that, if the remainder does not exceed Rs. 5, the charge for it shall be only 1 anna; if it does not exceed Rs. 10, the charge for it shall be only 2 annas; and if it does not exceed Rs. 15, the charge for it shall be only 3 annas.

The amount to be recovered on any postal article must not be more than Rs. 1000, and must not contain a fraction of an anna.

If the amount to be recovered on a value-payable registered article is not above Rs. 25 the article will be delivered by the postman, and the amount received by him, but if above Rs. 25, notice will be sent to the addressee and the parcel delivered only at the post office.

The system is extended, with the exception of unregistered parcels, packets and newspapers, to Ceylon, Portuguese India, Strait Settlements and the Somaliland Protectorate, provided the amount to be recovered does not exceed Rs. 600.

VALUE-PAYABLE SYSTEM AS APPLIED TO RAILWAYS.

Railway Administrations which agree not to deliver up a package declared at time of forwarding to be Value-Payable except on production of the receipt note.

1st Group.—Stations—Armenian Ghat Naihati, Goalundo, Chitpur, Ranaghat, Dacca, Calcutta, Khoolna, on Eastern Bengal State Railway and Bengal Central Railway; Darjeeling-Himalayan Railway.

2nd Group.—Patiala Railway, Amritsar-Pathankot Railway.

Any person forwarding parcels or goods, not exceeding Rs. 1,000 in value, from any station on the Railways above-mentioned for delivery at any station on a Railway belonging to the same group, can declare that they are being sent value-payable. The Railway clerk will then furnish a receipt with the letters V.-P. marked upon it which may be forwarded to the consignee by post.

VALUE-PAYABLE SYSTEM AS APPLIED TO RAILWAYS—contd.

Goods may be sent value-payable by any Railway by the sender addressing the package to himself. The sender must endorse the Railway Receipt to the Consignee for whom the package is intended, and present it open at the local post office, accompanied by the form referred above, the words "Railway Receipt Note" being entered in the spaces for description of the article. Each railway receipt must bear a fee in postage stamps of the value of two annas. The receipt-notes must not be enclosed in envelopes, but be presented open. The Post Office will then transmit the Railway receipt-note to the post office of destination, and effect delivery of it on the Consignee paying the value mentioned in the V.-P. receipt. *The Railway will not deliver up goods or parcels forwarded Value-Payable except on production of the corresponding receipt-note.*

The Rules also apply to receipt notes for goods conveyed by steamer within the limits of British India.

TELEGRAPHIC MONEY ORDERS.

(1) The remitter of a telegraphic money order may have it signalled either as an "Express" or as an "Ordinary" message by adding the word "Express" or "Ordinary" to the words "By telegraph" which he is already required to write across the money order form.

TELEGRAPHIC MONEY ORDERS—*contd.*

(2) A fee for the issue of a telegraphic money order will be charged at the rate of commission on an ordinary inland money order for the same amount, added to a telegraph charge calculated at the rates for inland telegrams for the actual number of words used in the telegram advising the remittance according as the telegram is to be sent as an "Express" or as an "Ordinary" message. The minimum charge for a telegraphic Money Order is Rs. 1, plus Money Order commission, if sent "Express"; 6 annas plus Money Order commission if sent "Ordinary."

The Telegraphic Money Order System does not apply to any Foreign Money Order Exchange except those with Ceylon and the Seychelles, but the remitter of a Foreign Money Order drawn on any other Foreign Country can have the particulars telegraphed to the Indian Office of Exchange and not to the Foreign Country of payment. The Indian Office of Exchange will on the receipt of the telegraphic advice, issue a Money Order on the Foreign Country of payment under the Foreign Money Order rules. The rates of Commission for such Foreign Money Orders are the same as ordinary Foreign Money Orders and the rules relating to Inland Telegraphic Money Orders also apply to these so far as the telegraph charge is concerned.

Telegraphic Money Orders may be sent to and from Aden at a telegraph charge of Rs. 1 per word for the words used in the advice plus Money Order commission.

FOREIGN PARCEL POST.

The sender will be required to specify clearly on the cover of the parcel or on the official label pasted to it the route by which it is to be forwarded.

The limit of weight for most foreign countries is 11 lbs. A despatch note form is also necessary for insured parcels for a *foreign* (as distinguished from a *British*) country or possession. Parcels for the United Kingdom over 11 lbs. and up to 50 lbs. are accepted for transmission through the P. & O. Company at the rate of 8 annas a lb. and are sent *via* Gibraltar. The maximum limit of size and value of a parcel differs according to the country of destination. The limits of value for insurance also vary.

Proviso 1.—No duty in excess of ten per cent. *ad valorem* shall be levied upon any of the articles mentioned in the above list when they are imported in reasonable quantity, for his own private use, by any person lawfully entitled to possess the same.

Proviso 2.—When any articles which have been otherwise imported, and upon which duty has been levied or is leviable under these numbers, are purchased retail from the importer by a person lawfully entitled as aforesaid, in reasonable quantity, for his own private use, the importer may apply to the Customs collector for a refund or remission (as the case may be) of so much of the duty thereon as is in excess of ten per cent. *ad valorem*; and if such Collector is satisfied as to the identity of the articles, and that such importer is in other respects entitled to such refund or remission, he shall grant the same accordingly.

N.B.—All rifles of .303, 577/450 bore of any pattern shall be considered as rifles capable of being used for military purposes, and a special order under Rule VI.—5 shall be required for their importation (Government of India Order No. 4583d, 30th July, 1901).

The above order is not applicable in the case of a rifle imported and cleared for the consignee by a firm of arm-dealers.

Except in these rules otherwise provided, fees, whether in amount or otherwise, shall be in the absolute discretion of the court. They shall be exclusive of any compensation which the court may be entitled to grant, and shall be fixed by the court at the termination of the suit, and the court shall certify accordingly.

Fees shall not be allowed in cases entered as compromised. In any cases where the defendant has intimated to the plaintiff his intention not to contest the suit Half fees will be allowed.

For the purpose of determining the fee to be allowed, the amount of debt or damage claimed, or the value of the property in dispute, shall be deemed to be the value of the suit.

Where an advocate appears instructed by an attorney or pleader, fees may be allowed to both, provided both have attended through the actual hearing of the case.

Where an attorney and pleader, or two or more pleaders, appear for the same party, one fee only shall be allowed, viz.: the fee of the leading practitioner.

Where there are several defendants, each with separate interests, one fee may be allowed to each successful defendant.

The institution costs have been reduced from two annas on the rupee to 7 pice on the rupee and the fee for other processes from 1 per cent. to $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

NOTE.—Under the discretion vested in the Small Cause Court, a fee of one-third is ordinarily allowed to pleaders in *ex parte* and non-contested cases, and to advocates and attorneys such fee as the Court thinks reasonable, but not less than Rs. 17 in suits exceeding Rs. 100. The full scales in the rules are for contested cases.

INDIAN INCOME TAX

(Under Act II. of 1886).

PART I.—SALARIES AND PENSIONS.

1. Any salary, annuity, pension or gratuity paid in British India to or on behalf of any person residing in British India, or serving on board a ship plying to or from British Indian ports, whether on account of himself or another person.

2. Any salary, annuity, pension or gratuity paid by the Government, or by a local authority established in the exercise of the powers of the Governor-General in Council in that behalf, to or on behalf of a British subject within the dominions of a Prince or State in India in alliance with His Majesty.

(a) If the income amounts to Rs. 2,000 per annum, or Rs. 166-10-8 per mensem or upwards—*five pies in the rupee*.

(b) If the income is less than Rs. 2,000 per annum, or Rs. 166-10-8 per mensem, but over Rs. 1,000 per annum, or Rs. 83-5-4 per mensem—*four pies in the rupee*.

NOTE.—"Salary" includes allowances, fees, commissions, perquisites or profits received, in lieu of, or in addition to, a fixed salary in respect of an office or employment of profit.

PART II.—PROFITS OF A COMPANY.

Five pies in the rupee on the whole of the nett profits made in British India by the Company during the year ending on the day on which the Company's accounts have been last made up, or, if the Company's accounts have not been made up within the year ending on the 31st day of March in the year immediately preceding that for which the assessment is to be made, then on the whole of the nett profits so made during the year ending on the said 31st day of March.

PART III.—INTEREST ON SECURITIES.

Interest becoming due on or after the first day of April, 1886, and payable in British India on—

INDIAN INCOME TAX—contd.

(a) Promissory notes, debentures, stock, or other securities of the Government of India (including securities of the Government of India, whereon interest is payable out of British India by draft on any place in British India), or

(b) Debentures or other securities for money issued by or on behalf of a local authority or Company.

Five pies in the rupee on such interest, unless the owner of the security produces a certificate signed by the Collector that his annual income from all sources is less than Rs. 1,000, in which case no deduction shall be made from the interest, or unless he produces a like certificate that his income from all sources is less than Rs. 2,000, in which case the rate shall be four pies in the rupee.

NOTE.—The tax must, at the time when and place where any of the interest is paid, be deducted therefrom by the person empowered to pay the interest, and be paid by that person within one week to the Collector of Income Tax.

EXEMPTIONS.

NOTE.—Income derived from Agriculture is not liable to taxation, but lands used for purposes other than Agriculture, mining, etc., are not exempt.

Sums paid to a Service Fund, to the Family Pension Fund, General Family Pension & Hindu Family Pension and any other Provident Fund or Association legally established under the authority and with the permission of Government, can be deducted from a person's income or profits, also the exact amount paid as premium on a life policy or deferred annuity (on production of premium receipt) provided such sum does not exceed one-sixth of the income or profits. Voluntary deposits in Railway Provident Funds and Savings Banks and other recognised Funds are not exempt.

The tax is 4 pies per rupee on annual salaries of Rs. 1,000 to less than Rs. 2,000, and 5 pies per rupee on Rs. 2,000 and upwards. Mess and band subscriptions, service funds, deductions, insurance premiums, travelling, tentage office, horse and sumptuary allowances, and all other allowances granted to meet specific expenditure are exempted from taxation. Military salaries of Rs. 500 and under per mensem are exempt from taxation. Military salaries above Rs. 500 per mensem brought under that amount by deduction of sums exempted are taxable on the nett balance.

The Benares and Ghazipur Beegah contains 3,600 square guj, or 3,136 square yards = nearly two Bengal beegahs. The Behar Beegah is 120 square hath = 180 square feet = 21,600 feet. The Indigo Beegah is 205 feet taken both ways = 410 feet.

The Government Luggee or Pole rules in Bengal, and is = $4\frac{1}{2}$ hath or $6\frac{3}{4}$ feet. The Behar Luggee is = 9 square feet. The Indigo Luggee varies greatly. In Champarun it ranges from 7 to 10 haths, while in Tirhoot the generally accepted luggee is $6\frac{1}{2}$ haths = 9 square feet. Thus 1 square Luggee = 1 Dhur, 20 Dhurs = 1 Cottah, 20 Cottahs, 1 Beegah.

- FOUR PER CENT.— " " SEVEN PER CENT.—Add $\frac{1}{4}$ of above. NINE PER CENT.— " " "
