- No 5. Burnished steel mouth mirror with Ivory handle
No 6. Ditto ditto
No 8. Glass mirror in Silver handle. (The silver part was home
made, the glasses were supplied by the dealers)
No 18. Dental key with removable end, Ebony handle
No 19. " of elevator type with " "
No 20. " with forceps handle
No 22. " with fulcrum which is adjustable attached
No 86. Lower forceps with ingenuous device for causing the
teeth to grip the tooth by means of an inclined plane
No 87. Forceps with fulcrum (probably lined with Gutta percha
to rest on adjoining tooth during the operation of
extraction
No 88. Lower(?) forceps with handles of ivory like a double
key.
No 10. Early form of Dental Drill to be worked by hand
No 11. also box containing drills for same
No 12. Early pattern of right angle dental drill

Bone Dentures

- No 24. Partial upper ivory denture carrying the two central incisors which are ~~carved~~ examples of porcelain teeth backed, soldered, fastened to the ivory portion by a single pivot.
- 28. Partial upper ivory denture carrying the central incisors the entire structure being carved out of the solid.
- 29. Partial lower denture of ivory carrying three natural incisors fixed to it by metal pivots the denture being drilled & countersunk ~~residually~~ for ligaturing to the other teeth
- 30. Complete upper denture of ivory. incisors. canines. 1st premolars being natural ~~teeth~~ riveted on with metal pins, molars carved out of the solid. Drilled for survivals to carry springs.
- 31. Complete lower ivory denture companion to no. 30 natural incisors etc. as on upper.
- 32. Complete lower ivory denture, carrying natural incisors, canines. & fitted with survivals.
- 33. Partial lower ivory denture the ivory forming bands to grip the natural premolars, molars carved from the soled.
- 34. Partial lower ivory denture carved from the solid.
- 42. Complete ivory lower. natural ~~teeth~~ to premolars, crowning canines in premolars
- 43. Complete ivory lower. carved from solid.

- No. 44. Partial ivory lower carved from solid made to embrace incisors, canines - premolars.
52 Partial ivory lower carved from solid with gold bands riveted on also survival for spring.
54. Complete lower carrying incisors, canines, 1st premolars showing marked canes of teeth & denture.
64. Stuck upper metal plate with natural teeth riveted on
65. Stuck upper metal enclosing canine, natural teeth, mounted, ivory molar blocks carrying survival.
66. Stuck up metal partial upper carrying three sailing porcelain teeth having been repaired by additional plated four rivets, by a gunner in H.M. Navy.
69. Complete upper & lower miniature Bone Dentures, probably samples of practice work.
70. Part upper ivory denture carry natural teeth & drilled in palate for attachment of some lining substance.
71. Metal denture with porcelain fronts, & ivory blocks in molar region carrying springs.

77 Denture composed of three blocks of Ivory held together
kept in position by thick oval wire (probably iron wire
but just made for a specimen case)

89 Complete upper ivory denture with 6 early mineral
teeth fixed on with Iron pins carved blocks for molars
screws for spring (N.B. This one & no. 74 are particularly
interesting as showing porcelain or mineral teeth mounted on
ivory bases.) Thus marking an advancement on the natural
