

Dear Miss Waterson: -

I received your letter some days ago but have been overwhelmed with work that needed immediate attention and with some other correspondence laid your letter one side.

We will send to Mr. Thompson (Custodian) of the Medical Historical Museum, London, W., one section of DR. HOWARD A. KELLY'S STEREO-CLINIC and also our new Staging that they may have the same on exhibit there. We will be very glad to do so, and later, if they desire, we might send one or two other operations which would prove of special value in an exhibit of that character.

I am sorry that you are not to be on the Pacific coast at the exhibit during the present year. Owing to financial conditions which have been very, very bad indeed, have not been so bad in many years, we are cutting our expenses in every possible way and have made no arrangement by which an exhibit will be made at the Exposition. My brother, R. W. E. Southworth, is on the Pacific coast doing considerable work himself. At present he is in San Francisco.

I note carefully what you say about the early stereoscope. What we are looking for is the most modern device by which the stereograms, text, etc, could be inclosed and in a case under lock and key which could be used in the libraries and medical colleges and so adjusted that the various operations could be examined. We hope some day to be able to produce something of this character. Would not be interested in the old scope as a matter of exhibit.

We are all looking for the hour when the awful war in Europe will end and when financial matters may be readjusted.


