Herewith please find the measurements you require.

No. 1 - the Alchemist. This is a standing upright figure, and in this case as in that of the other figures, we have sent the measurement for the sleeves from the shoulder to the wrist. In each case in the column for height we have measured from the nape of the neck to the feet, not including the head.

No. 2 - the Apothecary. Please note this is a seated figure.

No. 3 - the Physician. The blue costume is for this figure.

No. 5 - the Surgeon. The other blue costume with pink under-sleeves and the head-dress with drapery at the back is for this figure.

No. 6 - the Patient. This is a seated figure. Instead of sending the height of this figure, we have sent the measurement from the nape of the neck to the knee for the black tunic, which is 4 feet. The length of the leg from the top of the thigh to the bottom of foot is 30 inches.

Please note when delivered we should like someone to place the costumes on the figures.

I find I can enclose a sketch of the black costume for the seated patient. This should be all black.

I think it would be very much more satisfactory if you could have sent a man to take the measurements, in order to avoid any mistake. It might save trouble later in alterations.

This is not correct for the 16th century; it should be a black tunic reaching to about the knees, and black trunk hase and shoes, but no white whirt we he has depicted. I could let you have a sketch of this on hearing from you. I take it that your price includes the hats and head-dresses where necessary, and in the black one, just alluded to, it should include the black trunk hose.
