March 16th arnold When finding a large artery cut, I should first apply pressure on the side of the bound nearest the heart, by the fingers, if that were not sufficient to stop the bleeding I should then apply pressure, by means of a Tourniquet, until bleeding had ceased In case of venous bleeding, I should apply pressure on the side of the away from the heart, 'sufficiently, so stop bleeding by means of fight bandage In finding a person with a broken thigh, I should apply splints, placing one on the inner side of the leg, reaching from the groin to the foot, the outside one from the armpit to the end of the foot, securing them highly with bandages. & keeping the infured part in position, until able to obtain medical aid

For dislocated shoulder. I should bathe it with cold water. I and afterwards draw a bandage tightly round it.

In case of sprained ankle, I should first of all bathe the ankle in cold water. put a bandage tightly around
