

Dear Mr. Bruce Joy.



I may say we have usually paid from two to three guineas for a cast of a medallion of similar works. I mention this as you ask me the question.


If you would care to come in and see our Museum at any time convenient to you, I should be most pleased if you would do so, and enclose herewith a card of admission.
