You will find the measures of the old carving at the back of each photo, which I here repeat with the prices:

- 1 long panel carved wood - length <sup>metr.</sup> 2,05 x width <sup>m</sup> 0,96 - price £10
- 1 " " " " - length <sup>m</sup> 1,96 x width <sup>m</sup> 1,03 - price £10
- 1 Cupboard with shelves - height <sup>m</sup> 2,42 x width <sup>m</sup> 1,78 x depth <sup>m</sup> 0,59 - price £10
- 1 Big ornamental piece which stands at the Hall of the Hotel, measuring length <sup>m</sup> 4,60 x <sup>m</sup> 3,40 height price £600

I am mentioning the prices for each, which were offered to me very often. For the big piece the offer I had three years ago from an American visitor, was £800, at that time however I could not dispose of it, considering it was ornamenting the place.

I beg to enclose the plan of the big piece, which adapted to the photo will give you a perfect idea how it stands.

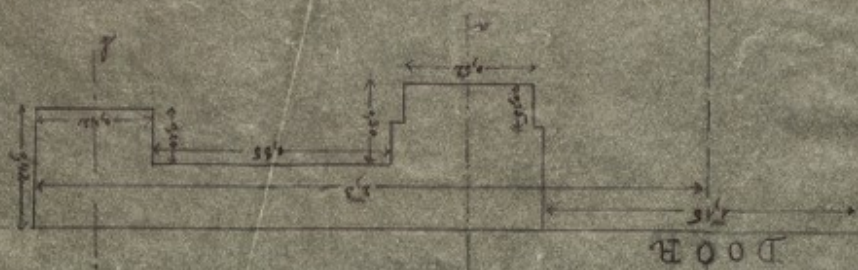
