Guardistalla, Tuscany, where it had been for two
or three centuries, as far as is known.

C. CENNI.

Bronze Cannon - model for great gun specially
designed for Ferdinand II. Inscribed "Fer. II. HETRU.
MAG. DVCE MDCXXXVIII."

Signed by the artist.

The gun bears the arms of the Medici family, and
the Lily of Florence. On the left of the Medici Arms
is the figure of Justice, and on the right the figure
of Minerva as Force (Strength).

The cannon is now in the Bargello.
