Reading some days ago Professor Ramsay's recent book on the "Seven Churches", I find he says that the word translated "eye-salve" in Revelation iii. 18. should rather be "the tablet of collyrium". The town of Laodicea had a famous medical school, and amongst the secret prescriptions of that school was one for the eye, made up into small cylinders, dissolved in the water, and dropped into the part affected. 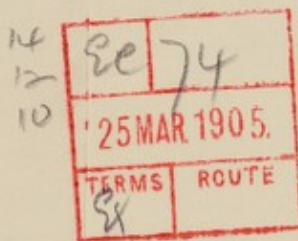
