Dear Sir,

Thanks for yours of the 7th inst. As I am going abroad very shortly for some time, perhaps it would be as well to carry out your suggestion and refund the balance that I paid in respect to the carboys not yet received.

At the present time I have only received three, one in good condition with stopper, one with stopper broken, and one minus a stopper. I am afraid these are not worth 4/8 (four shillings and sixpence), each to me as I originally offered for perfect specimens, but I should be willing to give 10/- (ten shillings) for the three, if you can send me two spare stoppers to make the other two perfect. When the other three carboys are traced, I will forward you a further amount for them immediately they are delivered.
