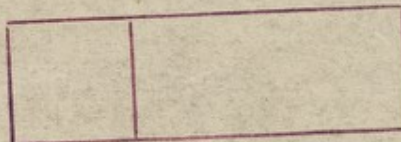
I beg to offer for your acceptance the accompanying copy of a booklet entitled "Antient Cymric Medicine" which I trust you may find of interest.

PEHENUKA, AN EGYPTIAN PRIEST-PHYSICIAN OF THE V DYNASTY, AND J'efa-SEN, HIS WIFE

By virtue of their superior intelligence and learning, the priesthood of antient Egypt, as of other early civilizations, united the two important offices of priest and physician. They ministered to the soul and healed the body. Pehenuka, who lived about 3,000 B.C., was physician at the court of King User-Ka-f. His wife, J'efa-Sen, who is also here depicted, was a priestess of Neit. The Egyptian priest-physicians of this remote period were renowned throughout the then known world for their skill and learning.

Reverend Sir

From the creation of the human race the healing of the body and the cure of the soul have been intimately associated. The priest-physician in this dual capacity has ever ministered to the needs of his fellow men. This is traceable throughout the centuries, and is perpetuated in the medical missionary of to-day. The priesthood kept the lamp of medical science burning through-

out the dark ages. Though it often flickered, by their devotion they kept it alight, and have handed down to us many of the simple truths accumulated by the Fathers of Medicine. In antient Egypt the priest-physicians were the sages of the land, and promoters of culture and enlightened thought.

There are in existence to-day many highly interesting relics associated with religio-medical matters, which, if brought together, would form an instructive link in the history of the healing art. Such items, for example, as relics associated with medicine and surgery in antient temples and monasteries, implements, instruments and manuscripts, etc. The mystic phases have peculiar interest, for example, votive offerings, sacred relics, scapulae, and amulets.

Your kind assistance in obtaining the loan of any such objects will be greatly appreciated.
