from a book. The size of the engraved part is $9 \times 7\frac{1}{4}$
inches; and the hand is outside the square, which I am
told fixes the date.

Lady Purcell-Taylor (who is a descendant of the John
Dollond whose microscopes are exhibited in the gallery) is

in Bacteriology &

engaged with me in certain researches, on the origin of diseases: and money would buy apparatus which would be more useful than the portrait.

It must be rare, for I have never seen another, and I think it must be worth £10.

If you think you are willing to give that sum, I will send it to you for examination.

Please note that the Dollond family have nothing to do with the cheap business now carried on in that name.
