Its age, I cannot say, but it was here when my predecessor bought the business (30 years ago), & the business has existed for over 100 years. Its weight is 50 lbs - fluid contents 6 pints; width at rim about 11". It ~~stands~~^{rests} on an old turned wood, worm eaten stand. The pestle is only an iron one. Just below the rim is a band of embossed work.
