Thanks for your kind letter of the 29th ult. with respect to the picture of John Bannister.

I have not seen the original and of course do not know its size. but I judge from what you say it is a miniature of the period, and probable done in body colour as used by the illuminating artists of the 16th century.

I am afraid a copy the exact size, as you suggest, would be too small for my ournose, and I should like it at least 2 feet 6 inches in length. the width in proportion. It could be copied either in oil or watercolour, preferably I think the former. An enlarged reproduction will be much easiet to do than a small one, and perhaps you will kindly let me know what this would cost in oil the size I suggest.
