Thanks for your kind letter of the 29th ult. with respect to the picture of John Bannister.

I have not seen the original and of course do not know its size. but I judge from what you say it is a miniature of the period, and probably done in body colour as used by the illuminating artists of the 16th century.

I am afraid a copy the exact size, as you suggest, would be too small for my purpose, and I should like it at least 2 feet 6 inches in length, the width in proportion. It could be copied either in oil or watercolour, preferably I think the former. An enlarged reproduction will be much easier to do than a small one, and perhaps you will kindly let me know what this would cost in oil the size I suggest.

Since writing you I find there is a chance of the original volume containing the picture being loaned to me for a time, so kindly wait before proceeding further with the matter until I write you again.

Dear Sir,

I have seen the picture of 'John Bannister' - I found it very much smaller than I expected & wonder if you know the size of the original. It is in a manuscript Book along with other pictures of less importance & measures only something like 14" x 10". It is a very intricate piece of work & very well done - finer I think than the reproduction would suggest. I think to make a really first class replica I should want Ten Guineas. I would suggest that the copy be the same size as the original unless it is necessary to enlarge it for some purpose. The picture is painted in Tempera I think. I understand that there is some doubt as to whether the Authorities will allow the picture to be copied -
