Dear Mr. Pinker,

With respect to the cast of Oannes the Assyrian God, I am reserving the payment of that until you make the casting perfect,

I am sorry to say last night without any warning we noticed the legs cracked again just above the ankles where they gave way before, and it is evident that the iron supports you have put in are not sufficient for the weight of the body.

Something must be done at once to remedy this, or I am afraid of the collapse of the whole figure, which I need hardly say would be a calamity and a great loss to us.

In its present condition it is impossible to move it, and I should like to see you as soon as you possible can as I must have it made secure and firm without delay.

I have several other objects put on one side for repairs when you call, but it is most important and urgent that the cast should have immediate attention.

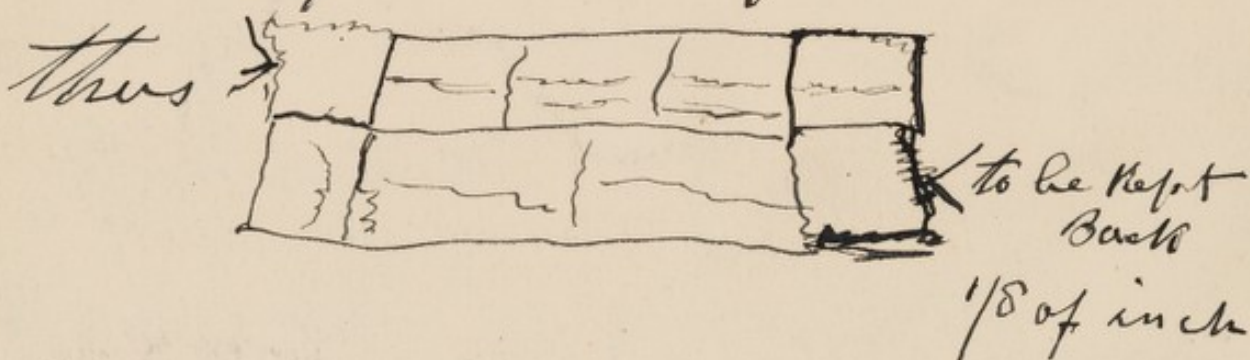
Having Examined the tablet
