Dear Sir,

I enclose a few old surgical instruments which were formerly the part of the equipment of a naval surgeon & were given to me several years ago. Under separate cover I am sending an old bongie & a certificate from Guy's Hospital dated 1844, which bears the signatures of some of the older surgeons.
