Dr. Home visited the West End Exhibition Room, Wigmere Street, W. on the 24th inst. We append a copy of the report we have received:-

"Dr. H. was Secretary of the International Congress on "Tuberculosis in 1901 and says it was he who induced Koch to "come ever and gave his famous address. For that Congress "Prof. Koch brought over 3 tubes containing cultures of his "original bacillus and afterwards presented them to Dr. Home." Dr. H. wondered if they would interest Mr. Wellcome and whether he would like the loan of them for the H.M.E.; he says he "also possesses several other relics which he would be pleased to land. We thanked him for the offer and said you would no "doubt write to him direct."
