

AT a Meeting of OFFICERS of the MEDICAL DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY, held at N^o 5, *Berkeley Street*, 8th June, 1820;

SIR JAMES M^cGRIGOR IN THE CHAIR,

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTIONS WERE PUT, AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY;—viz.

1.—Proposed by Sir J. M^cGRIGOR, and seconded by Dr. FRANKLIN:—That A BENEVOLENT FUND be established; for the Benefit of the ORPHANS OF ARMY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

2.—Proposed by Mr. BERRY, and seconded by Dr. GORDON:—That Sir JAMES M^cGRIGOR be requested to accept the Office of PRESIDENT of the ARMY MEDICAL OFFICERS BENEVOLENT FUND.

3.—Proposed by Dr. EMERSON, and seconded by Mr. DAVIES:—That a Committee be appointed to draw up a Code of Regulations for the Management of the Fund, and to submit the same to a General Meeting of the Subscribers and Friends of the Fund, to be held at N^o 5, Berkeley Street, on Friday, 1st September, at One o'Clock:—

With power to add to their number.

4.—Proposed by Mr. ELLIOTT, and seconded by Mr. BAIRD:—That Dr. GORDON and Dr. GREGORY be requested to prepare, for circulation among the Medical Officers of the Army, an Address, stating the Objects of the Fund, and an Outline of the Means by which it is proposed to carry the same into effect.

SIR JAMES M^cGRIGOR having obligingly signified his acceptance of the Office of President of the Fund,

5.—Proposed by Dr. GREGORY, and seconded by Dr. G. SMITH:—That the thanks of the Meeting be given to Sir JAMES M^cGRIGOR, as well for his ready acquiescence in the wishes of the Meeting, by his acceptance of the Office of President of the Fund, as for his exertions in the Chair on the present occasion.

THE ARMY MEDICAL OFFICERS BENEVOLENT FUND is instituted with the view of affording relief to those Orphans of Army Medical Officers who may be left under circumstances of particular distress; or who may be enabled, by a small addition of Income at a certain period of their lives, to procure a better Education than their limited means would otherwise allow; or who may require some Assistance on their first Establishment in Life. Urgent cases of this description must have fallen under the notice of almost every one; and benevolent attempts have frequently been made to procure the requisite aid by means of private subscription. To provide a *permanent* and *separate* Fund, expressly calculated to meet these cases of peculiar hardship, appeared to many Gentlemen a most desirable object.

The leading feature of this Fund is, that it is Benevolent. The Objects of its bounty will be selected from among those who produce the strongest claims upon its support. Where there is any equality of claim, the preference will be shewn to the Orphans of those whose Parents contributed to the Fund. Orphans who have lost both Father and Mother, will, if otherwise destitute, be considered to have a superior claim. Those whose Mothers are living may be admitted however to its benefits, provided the Mother's income is inadequate to the Education of the Orphans. Upon the whole, the nature of the Claims which may be made being very indefinite, it is not proposed to limit the bounty by any specification of age or otherwise. The circumstances of each case will be judged of annually, first by a Committee, and afterwards by a General Meeting, who will ultimately select the cases proper for relief, and specify the amount to be afforded to each. This will be regulated by the circumstances of each case, and the extent of means, of which the Fund may be possessed in each year. It is understood that relief by this Fund is always to be afforded in the form of periodical *donations*, and never in that of *annuity*, even for a limited number of years.

A Fund, such as may be sufficient for the fulfilment of these objects, it is proposed to raise by means of Donations, life, and annual Subscriptions. Hereafter it is hoped that the Opulent in the Department will remember this Fund in their testamentary dispositions. Donations will be thankfully received from all Officers of the Army, and others, who may be desirous of promoting its benevolent objects.

The plan proposed precludes all chance of failure. No precise amount of relief is specified:—all ideas of Annuity are repressed. Whether the sum annually to be divided be small or large, it will go towards the support of those to whom even a small assistance cannot be unacceptable. In the distribution of the Fund hereafter, every thing will be entrusted to that spirit of BENEVOLENCE which led to its first establishment, and which, it is hoped, will soon place the Fund in a situation to fulfil many of those objects for which it was designed.

THE preceding ADDRESS having been laid before a very numerous Meeting of Army Medical Officers, held in Berkeley Street, 15th June, 1820, Sir JAMES M^cGRIGOR in the Chair, it was unanimously resolved that the same be printed and circulated among the Officers of the Medical Department of the Army.

At the same Meeting the question was discussed, “Whether the Regulations of “the Fund could be so framed, that the Children of such Medical Officers as have Families “but no Wife, might have a *distinct claim* for relief?” when it was agreed,—that such a proposition could not be entertained, it being incompatible with the other objects of the Fund.

Subscriptions and Donations will be received by all the Members of the Committee; by Mr. WINDOW, Agent for Army Hospitals; and by Mr. TANNER, at the Army Medical Board Office, No. 5, Berkeley Street.

To prevent unnecessary delay, any Donations or Subscriptions which may be received in aid of the ARMY MEDICAL OFFICERS BENEVOLENT FUND, previous to submitting the Regulations to a General Meeting, will be immediately vested in the Navy 5 per Cents, in the names of Dr. SOMERVILLE and Dr. GORDON.

REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF *The Army Medical Officers Benevolent Fund,*

LAID BEFORE THE GENERAL MEETING,

HELD AT

No. 5, BERKELEY STREET, PICCADILLY, 15th MAY, 1822.

SIR JAMES M'GRIGOR in the Chair.

THE Committee of the *Army Medical Officers Benevolent Fund*, experience the highest satisfaction in laying before the General Meeting of the Subscribers, a Statement of the Proceedings which have taken place since its first Institution, and in announcing to them its present State.

When it is remembered, that the Fund has been established for a period little exceeding Eighteen months, the Committee feel assured, that its Friends and Supporters will be gratified by hearing, that in that time the Sum of £1047 5s. 4d. has been actually received, and placed to the credit of the Fund; and that a farther sum of £40. has been announced as already collected. With this, the Committee have been enabled to purchase Stock in the Navy 5 per Cents. to the Amount of £879. 0s. 6d.

The amount of Annual Subscriptions, it has not hitherto been in the Power of the Committee accurately to ascertain; as in many instances the Contributors have omitted to state, whether the Sum, paid by them were by way of Donation, or of Annual Subscription. They believe them, however, to be such as with the Interest upon the Funded Capital, (at the reduced Rate) makes the Annual Receipts of the Fund to amount to nearly £100., independent of Donations. These have been, and still continue to be very numerous, and the Committee have the greatest pleasure in holding up to the notice of the Subscribers, and the Medical Department of the Army generally, those among the Donors, who by their greater liberality or more extended exertions in behalf of the Fund, have placed it in its present prosperous condition.

To SIR JAMES M'GRIGOR, President of the Fund, the warmest thanks of the Committee are justly due. The friendly interest which the Director-General has always taken in the success of the Fund, may be estimated as well from his liberal Contributions, as from the exertions he has made to diffuse throughout the Medical Department of the Army, a knowledge of the benevolent objects which it embraces.

To the Trustees, THEODORE GORDON, Esq. and DR. SHAPTER, the Subscribers are equally indebted for a liberal Contribution, and for the care and attention with which they have fostered the early growth of the Fund.

SIR JAMES FELLOWES, Inspector of Hospitals, on receiving the first notice of the formation of the Fund, placed £50. at the disposal of the Committee, expressing, at the same time, his warmest wishes for the success of so laudable an undertaking.

DR. CARNEGIE, Surgeon (H. P.) 62nd Regiment, contributed in the same generous manner the Sum of Fifty Guineas, and the Committee have very great pleasure in noticing an instance of liberality so honourable to himself, and to the Department.

The Court of Assistants of the Worshipful Society of Apothecaries, (by a Letter addressed to the Secretary, through E. BACOT, Esq.) have expressed their intention of making an Annual Donation to the Fund of Ten Guineas, and their good wishes in its behalf are further evinced in their very liberal retrospect of the three past Years.

SIR LUCAS PEPYS, Physician-General to the Army, has presented to the Fund the Sum of Twenty Guineas; and a like Sum has been received from MR. WINDOW, Agent for Army Hospitals, Banker to the Fund; and from MR. JACKSON, Surgeon 14th Foot.

DR. RENNY, Director-General of the Irish Medical Department, has paid into the Treasurer's Hands, the Sum of Twenty Pounds; and a similar Sum has been received from MR. PEARCE Surgeon 30th Foot.

The Committee beg to express, in a particular manner, their obligations to several Gentlemen in charge of the Medical Department in the Colonies, whose benevolent Exertions in support of the Fund, have been met by a corresponding liberality on the part of the Medical Officers on the Station.

The Committee, in particular, have to notice the Collection made in Jamaica, under the auspices of DR. ADOLPHUS, Deputy-Inspector of Hospitals, amounting to £72. 8s.—In the East Indies, MR. SMET, Surgeon 8th Light Dragoons, contributed the Sum of Thirty Guineas, and was the means of procuring Donations of Ten Guineas each, from A. GIBB, Esq. Superintending Surgeon at Meerut; and from G. REDDIE, Esq. Superintending Surgeon at Cawnpore.

From Nova Scotia, Dr. STRACHAN, Deputy Inspector of Hospitals, has remitted Donations to the Amount of Fourteen Guineas; and Dr. NICOLL, Deputy Inspector, has announced a Subscription among the Medical Officers, stationed at Sierra Leone, amounting to upwards of £40.

These proofs of the generous feelings of the Officers of the Medical Department of the Army, have been accompanied by the strongest expressions of their satisfaction at the Establishment of the Fund, and the warmest wishes of the Donors for its increasing prosperity. The Committee feel assured, that so supported and encouraged, it cannot fail of soon reaching that point at which it may commence its career of usefulness; but they are equally convinced, that this cannot be attained until the Fund has accumulated, so as to yield a Yearly Permanent Interest of £100.

The Committee during the last Twelvemonth, have had occasion to witness several instances in which the support of this Fund would have been, in the highest degree, useful to Families, and honourable to the Department. Their regret, at being compelled, for the present, to remain inactive, has been however considerably abated by observing the gradual advances of the Fund, and by their full confidence, that, when it becomes more generally known among the Officers of the Department, the generous and charitable among them, whose names are not already enrolled in the List of Subscribers, will speedily come forward in its support; and complete the plan which has been formed for affording relief to the Widows and Orphans of Medical Officers of the Army, and giving increased Character and Dignity to the Department.

The Committee, in conclusion, beg to suggest a hope, that the more opulent among their brother Officers will remember this useful Fund in their Testamentary Dispositions; and they pledge themselves to give effect to any benevolent Intentions which the Testators may express.

The REPORT having been read, the Meeting proceeded to elect Dr. THEODORE GORDON, and Dr. M. A. BURMESTER, Members of the Committee, in the room of Mr. GUTHRIE and Dr. EMERSON.—And Dr. SOMERVILLE and Mr. JAMES, Auditors of the Accounts for 1822-23. After which the Thanks of the Meeting were voted to the Committee for their activity and zeal in the cause of the Institution.

The Thanks of the Meeting were also voted to the Auditors and the Secretary.

REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF
THE ARMY MEDICAL OFFICERS BENEVOLENT FUND,

LAID BEFORE THE SECOND ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING,

HELD AT

No. 5, BERKELEY STREET, PICCADILLY, 16th MAY, 1823.

SIR WILLIAM FRANKLIN IN THE CHAIR.

THE Committee submit to the consideration of the General Meeting a Report of the Proceedings and Progress of the Establishment.

They refer with unfeigned satisfaction to the Report of last Year, from the circumstance of being enabled to say that all the favourable anticipations of that period have been realized. The Fund may indeed be almost said to have advanced rapidly. Last Year the Money invested in the Navy Five per Cents. amounted to £.879. 0s. 6d. Stock.

This Year the amount of Stock in the New Four per Cents. is £.1000; and in the Three per Cent. Consols, £.678. 5s. 7d.

In referring to the names of those Gentlemen that were especially mentioned in the former Report, as active and liberal Contributors to the Fund, the Committee have the gratification of announcing that SIR LUCAS PEPYS, Physician-General of the Army, has given another Sum of Ten Guineas, and signified his intention of becoming an Annual Donor to that Amount.

Dr. NICOLL, the Deputy Inspector of Hospitals, on the Western Coast of Africa, has remitted home the Sum which he had announced as subscribed by the Medical Officers under his superintendence, amounting in the whole to £.51. 8s.

Dr. ADOLPHUS, in addition to the Sum formerly reported as having been collected in and remitted from Jamaica, has sent home the Amounts of a Second and a Third Contribution, of £.84. 8s., and £.34, respectively. The Committee have signified to these Gentlemen how highly their exertions are appreciated; and have assured them of the warmest thanks of the general body of Subscribers for such efficient Aid to the Institution.

Among the new Contributions, the Committee desire particularly to bring under the notice of the Meeting the Sum of £.22. 1s. 8d. which Dr. MASON GOOD has been authorised to transfer to this Fund:—It is Part of the remaining Monies in the Hands of the Managers of an Association whose object has been completed, and those Gentlemen have judged it expedient to distribute the Balance among certain Establishments, connected with the Profession, having for their ends the like benevolent Purposes with that of the Medical Officers of the Army. This is one proof among many, of the excellent understanding and good feeling of the Profession at large, towards that part of it more immediately engaged in the Military Service of the Country.

The Committee have further much pleasure in noticing the liberal Contribution of Twenty Guineas by CHARLES MANSFIELD CLARKE, Esq.

The Committee forbear to particularise the Names of several new Contributors, to avoid prolixity in a Report of this nature; but they suggest that the whole be separately printed, as an Appendix to the List of last Year. They have also the pleasure to observe the names of several Ladies as Annual Subscribers; and they recommend that these be distinctly and separately inserted at the head of this Second Return of Benefactors. The Committee feel perfectly assured that the circumstance of Ladies' Subscriptions being received, requires only to be known to augment very materially this source of Income.

The Meeting will have noticed that a Part of the Money lately invested, has been placed in the Three per Cent. Consols, while the original Rules had designated another description of Stock for these Investments. But that Stock having been materially changed by the Legislature, the Committee, with the approbation of the Trustees, have thought it justifiable to recur to what is usually held the most eligible description of Stock among the Public Funds, and they trust this arrangement will meet the approbation of the Meeting.

In conclusion, the Committee revert with pleasure to the favourable and encouraging prospects of the Fund. They trust that the large Sum of Money bestowed as Donations on the Widows' Fund, will soon be transferred to this, agreeably to the general consent of the Donors, and in accordance with the views that first prompted their liberality. This addition to the Fund will be of the highest import, by augmenting the means to such an extent as to allow of distributions (from the Interest of the Stock), being commenced perhaps very early in the ensuing Year.

Still the Committee would urge the expediency of a constant attention to the augmentation of this most useful Fund.—It is to be remembered that the distribution commences at its minimum; and to whatever extent it may arrive, the Committee anxiously trust that its means will keep pace with the claims of the unfortunate.

The REPORT having been read, the Meeting proceeded to elect J. W. DUNKIN, Esq. and TITUS BERRY, Esq. Members of the Committee, in the room of Dr. BURMESTER and Dr. GREGORY;—and P. M'GREGOR, Esq. and Dr. GEORGE GREGORY, Auditors of the Accounts for the ensuing Year.

The Thanks of the Meeting were then voted to the Trustees, the Committee, the Auditors, and the Secretary.

LAID BEFORE THE THIRD ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING,

HELD AT

No. 5, BERKELEY STREET, PICCADILLY, 14th MAY, 1824.

SIR JAMES M'GRIGOR IN THE CHAIR.

R. A. M. M. / Report of the Army Medical Officers Benevolent Fund

THE Committee of the ARMY MEDICAL OFFICERS BENEVOLENT FUND, in submitting to the General Meeting a Report of the Progress of the Fund during the last Year, have the satisfaction of announcing that the advances which it has made are considerable; and if the flattering expectations of the former Report have not been fully realised, that the disappointment has been owing to circumstances neither foreseen, nor under control.

The General Meeting will hear with regret, that difficulties have arisen in fulfilling the benevolent Intentions of the Members of the Widows' Fund, and that the large Sums bestowed as Donations to that Fund, cannot (for the present at least) owing to the legal construction of certain clauses in the Deed of Settlement of the Society, be rendered available to the objects of this Establishment.

The Committee, in making this communication, desire at the same time to express their firm belief, that these impediments to the proposed Transfer have been equally regretted by the Committee and Members of the Widows' Fund; and they are sure that the General Meeting will join them in expressing their cordial thanks to that Body, for the disposition which they have invariably manifested to promote the measure. The Committee, however, by no means despair of its ultimate accomplishment, indulging the hope that means may hereafter be found, which will give the strictest legal sanction to the generous intentions of the Members of the Widows' Fund.

The total Amount of the Benevolent Fund at the present time, is £1,000. Stock in the New Four per Cents., and £1,118. 5s. in the Three per Cent Consols; affording an Annual Interest of £73. 10s.

The Committee have had under their consideration the necessity now existing (in consequence of the abolition of the Navy Five per Cents,) of some alteration in that Rule which prescribes the Time at which the distribution of the Fund should commence. Being convinced that a permanent Annual Income of £100. arising from the Interest of vested Property, is the lowest point at which the Fund can commence its operations with any prospect of real utility, they have resolved to recommend to the General Meeting an alteration in the Regulations to such an effect; and they trust that the general Body of Subscribers, when they reflect on the probable number of applicants for relief, will be satisfied of the necessity of such a limitation.

The Committee have the pleasure to announce a Donation of Ten Guineas from W. McDOWALL, Esq., Superintending Surgeon of the Honourable East India Company's Service; and they have peculiar satisfaction in again bringing under the notice of the General Meeting the liberality of THE WORSHIPFUL SOCIETY OF APOTHECARIES, and of SIR LUCAS PEPYS, Physician-General of the Army, who continue their Annual Contributions of Ten Guineas.

The General Meeting will perceive with pleasure, that the List of Ladies Subscriptions has very materially augmented; and the Names of Lady M'GRIGOR, Lady FELLOWES, Lady MEADE, Mrs. THOMSON, Mrs. TRUMBLE, and Mrs. GUNSON, with their very liberal Donations, cannot fail to attract notice. While offering their acknowledgments to these Ladies for their support, the General Meeting will anticipate with the Committee the further extension of this List, as the benevolent objects of the Fund become more generally known.

The Committee have had ample opportunities of observing in how great a degree the Fund is indebted for its present prosperity to the exertions of the President, SIR JAMES M'GRIGOR; and they should not feel they had fully discharged their duty, without attempting to impress the general Body of Subscribers with a sense of the many obligations which are due to him for such efficient patronage.

It remains only that the Committee urge upon the General Meeting the necessity of continuing their exertions in behalf of the Fund. It is not, perhaps, generally known that the objects of the Society's bounty are numerous, and that very many Widows and Orphans are anxiously waiting for the period when its benevolent operations may commence. The hope held out in the last Annual Report, that a distribution of the Interest of the Stock might possibly take place in the course of the present year, slight as it was, induced several most deserving Persons to forward to the Committee their Claims; and it was with great pain that the Committee were compelled to withhold from them any prospect of immediate assistance.

The Fund, however, has now reached that point, when a slight addition to the united zeal of its friends will enable it to commence its career of active charity; and the Committee are well assured, that an Appeal thus addressed to the liberality of their Brother Officers, will not be made in vain.

The REPORT having been read, the Meeting proceeded to elect RALPH GREEN, Esq. SAMUEL COOPER, Esq. and GEORGE GREGORY, M.D. Members of the Committee, in the room of SIR WILLIAM FRANKLIN, SAMUEL REED, Esq. and J. W. DUNKIN, Esq.;—and SIR WILLIAM FRANKLIN, and SAMUEL REED, Esq. Auditors of the Accounts for the ensuing Year.

The Thanks of the Meeting were then voted to the Trustees, the Committee, the Auditors, and the Secretary.

REPORT
OF THE COMMITTEE OF
THE ARMY MEDICAL OFFICERS BENEVOLENT FUND,

LAID BEFORE THE FOURTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING,

HELD AT

No. 5, BERKELEY STREET, PICCADILLY, 20th MAY, 1825.

DR. BORLAND IN THE CHAIR.

THE rapid advance which the ARMY MEDICAL OFFICERS BENEVOLENT FUND has made since the date of the last Report, is a source of the highest gratification to the Committee; and it is with feelings of the most lively satisfaction that they announce to the Members generally, that a few months will place it in a situation to commence its career of usefulness.

The Donations and Subscriptions received during the year terminating May 20th, 1825, amount to £.501 : 3s.; a sum exceeding by £.132 the corresponding Receipts of the preceding year. The Funded Capital has been augmented, during the same period, by the sum of £.626 : 14s. 2d. Three per Cent. Consols, so as to present, on this day, an Aggregate of £.1000. New Four per Cents., and nearly £.1750, Three per Cent. Consols; affording an Annual Interest of £.90. There is only wanting, therefore, at the present Price of the Funds, the Sum of £.185, in addition to the Balance in hand, to obtain that permanent Annual Income of £.100, when the Fund, by the Resolution of the last Annual General Meeting, may commence its benevolent operations. From the experience of former years, the Committee confidently anticipate the Receipt of this Sum prior to the end of December. There will then remain the January Dividends, and a considerable portion of the Annual Subscriptions and Donations, for distribution at the General Meeting in May next. To that period the Committee look forward with sincere pleasure, well persuaded that the long cherished expectations of the Friends of the Fund will then be amply realised.

The gratifying task now devolves upon the Committee of directing the notice of the Subscribers, and of the Medical Officers of the Army generally, to those Individuals by whose benevolent exertions during the past year, the Fund has been so ably supported.

To SIR LUCAS PEPPYS, Physician-General of the Army, and to THE WORSHIPFUL SOCIETY OF APOTHECARIES, the Committee have again to express their obligations. The Annual Contributions of Ten Guineas, coeval with the Establishment of the Fund, are still continued by them with a liberality which merits the warmest thanks of the Members.

The noble example of benevolence thus set, has been followed by JOHN CALVERT CLARKE, Esq., who, in the same spirit which was manifested on the formation of the WIDOWS' SOCIETY, has expressed his intention of becoming an Annual Contributor of Ten Pounds to the Benevolent Fund.

J. F. SMET, Esq. Surgeon 8th Dragoons, has evinced his regard for the Department, and his generous feelings in behalf of the distressed Widows and Orphans of its Medical Officers, by a Donation of Thirty Guineas, in addition to one of the same amount, already gratefully recorded in the Report of 1822. It is peculiarly gratifying to the Committee to find the power of doing good thus happily united to the most benevolent disposition of mind.

In very distant parts of the Empire a similar zeal for the improvement of the Fund has manifested itself. JOHN HUME, Esq., Surgeon 59th Regiment, has transmitted from India a Second Collection, amounting to Eighteen Pounds; and has exerted himself strenuously in making known, throughout that Country, the existence and objects of this Fund. M. W. KENNY, Esq. Surgeon 67th Regiment, has, from the same Quarter, forwarded a Donation of Ten Guineas, expressing, at the same time, his intention of becoming a Contributor of Five Guineas for the Four next Years.

The Committee have further to record the Receipt, during the Year, of various Donations of Ten Guineas, for which they beg to offer their cordial thanks. A List of these will be found annexed to the present Report.

It is highly satisfactory to the Committee to perceive that the Subscriptions from the Ladies of Army Medical Officers are gradually augmenting. They look forward, too, with confidence, to a still further increase in them, satisfied that the example of the Ladies whose names appear in the present List will not be lost on others, who, though not contributing to the Fund, must feel equally interested in its future success.

The Committee have, next, to direct the especial attention of the Subscribers to the zeal manifested in behalf of the Fund from its very first establishment, by their Secretary, Mr. TANNER. His services have been throughout gratuitous, and the Committee can with truth say, that no remuneration could, in their opinion, have added, in any degree, to the accuracy which he has displayed in keeping the Accounts of the Fund, nor to the unwearyed attention which he has given to its general superintendance.

In conclusion, the Committee desire it to be understood, that any Memorials in favour of Persons anxious to obtain Relief from the Fund, should be transmitted to the Secretary, or to any Member of the Committee, in the Months of January and February, 1826. Each Case will be duly investigated and reported on by the Committee; but the *Selection* of deserving Cases, and the Amount of Relief to be afforded to each, will be entirely at the discretion of such Members as may be present at the Annual General Meeting in May next.

The REPORT having been read, it was moved, and resolved unanimously, That the same be printed and circulated extensively among the Medical Officers of the Army.

The Chairman then directed the especial attention of the Gentlemen present to that part of the Report which noticed the smallness of the Sum required to place the Fund in an efficient condition (£185), and trusted that the generous feelings of the Friends of the Fund would not suffer it to languish long for want of so trifling an addition. The following Sums were thereupon subscribed, and directed to be immediately added to the Funded Stock.

THE Committee of "The Army Medical Officers' Benevolent Society" would hold themselves wanting in duty to those by whom they were nominated, if they failed to render an account of their stewardship; more especially when the facts which they have to announce, regarding the progressive increase of the Fund confided to their care, are satisfactory beyond what even the most sanguine expectations of its early promoters ventured to anticipate.

The Receipts of the Benevolent Fund have this year exceeded the sum of £1,000, being £300 more than had been received during any former year since its establishment. There are about Fifty new Subscribers, of One Guinea annually.

The Funded Stock of the Society now amounts to £1,000 Four per Cents., and £3,500 Three per Cent. Consols, affording the annual Interest of £145. At the present price of the Funds, this would produce nearly £4,000 sterling.

In consequence of the zealous and gratuitous services of the Secretary of the Society, its proceedings are conducted at an expense little more than nominal.

Such is a brief sketch of the present condition of "The Army Medical Officers' Benevolent Fund." It remains for the Committee to hold up to the notice, and, they may safely add, the admiration, of the Subscribers, and of the Hospital Staff of the Army generally, the Names of those Individuals who have been chiefly instrumental in carrying into execution this work, so highly honourable to the Department, and promising such an ample harvest of public utility hereafter.

The interest which the Ladies of the Department have always taken in the success of the Fund—never more conspicuous than during the present year—merits the warmest thanks of the Committee. Several Donations of Ten Guineas have been received from them, besides others of smaller amount; among which, the Committee would especially notice those of Mrs. Adolphus and Mrs. Hackett.

The anxious wishes of the Director-General to excite, among the Officers in charge of Foreign Stations, a zeal in the cause of the Orphans' Fund, have been met by a corresponding energy and liberality on their part, which calls for the strongest expressions of thanks from the Committee.

Dr. Adolphus, Inspector of Hospitals in Jamaica, has signalized himself in this benevolent work: his exertions for many years past have been strenuous and unceasing. In his own family he has contributed upwards of £60; and he has been instrumental in procuring Donations and Subscriptions from others, to the amount of £300.

To Dr. James Forbes, Inspector of Hospitals in Canada, the Society is also largely indebted; he having just transmitted a List of Contributions from the Officers under his command to the amount of £160.

The Subscriptions from Sierra Leone, amounting to Fifty Guineas, collected and transmitted by the late Dr. Nicoll; and those from Nova Scotia, by the hands of Dr. Strachan, Inspector of Hospitals, amounting to Fourteen Guineas, have been noticed in former Reports.

The Receipts from India already announced, for which the Society is indebted to the joint exertions of Mr. Smet and Surgeon Hume, of the 59th, amount to £136; and further assistance from the same quarter may reasonably be expected, when the Committee consider that the principal stations there are now superintended by zealous friends of the Fund, two of whom have furnished large Contributions during the present year—viz. Dr. Burke, Inspector of Hospitals at Calcutta, who has recently transmitted Twenty-five Guineas, in addition to former payments of Twelve Guineas; and Dr. Strachan, Inspector of Hospitals at Bombay, who has also remitted a Donation of Twenty Guineas.

The Committee, further, desire to express their particular obligations to the Surgeon-General of Ireland, for his Donation of Twenty Pounds. Likewise to Staff-Surgeons Melin, Simpson, Burton, and Bell, for their liberal Contributions.

There will be found among the Subscribers to the Fund many warm supporters whose liberality is not confined to the payment of a single sum, but who contribute annually to the extent of Ten Guineas. The Committee desire to express their particular thanks to the Worshipful Society of Apothecaries; to Sir Lucas Pepys, Bart.; to Calvert Clark, Esq.; and Robert Glasgow, Esq.; who are distinguished by this display of generous feeling. Dr. Hamilton, Staff Surgeon, and M. W. Kenney, Esq., Surgeon 67th Regiment, annual contributors of Five Guineas each, merit also, in an especial manner, the notice of the Subscribers, and the thanks of the Committee.

To the Medical Officers of the Department generally, who, by their smaller, but not less useful Contributions, swell the stream of charity to its present gratifying amount, the thanks of the Committee are no less justly due; and to them they desire to express, individually, their obligations for the confidence which has been reposed in them. As Members of the Committee, they have enjoyed the highest gratification in witnessing so many pleasing proofs of zeal for the Department, and of generous enthusiasm in the cause of the Orphan and the Friendless.

In conclusion, the Committee beg leave to lay before the General Meeting their proposed arrangement for the distribution of the Fund for the current year: viz.—

The Committee propose, that the distributions shall extend to One Hundred and Fifty Pounds for the year.

REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF

THE ARMY MEDICAL OFFICERS' BENEVOLENT SOCIETY,

LAID BEFORE THE SEVENTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING,

HELD

At Willis's Rooms, King Street, St. James's, on the 22nd of May, 1828.

W. W. FRASER, Esq. Inspector of Hospitals, in the Chair.

THE Committee of "The Army Medical Officers' Benevolent Fund" desire to report, that they have devoted their best attention to the interests of the Fund during the past year, and have been seconded by a corresponding feeling on the part of their Brother Officers, highly honourable to their spirit and liberality.

In entering upon their duties, they could not but feel some hesitation. It was scarcely reasonable to hope, that the stream of Benevolence, which had flowed uninterruptedly for seven years, and brought the Fund into its present prosperous condition, should continue; but it is now the pleasing duty of that Committee to state, that such expectations have been agreeably disappointed—that the springs of Charity are still as productive as ever, and that the Receipts of the past year have scarcely been exceeded by those of any year since the establishment of the Fund.

It will be seen, by reference to the annexed Statement of the Society's Accounts, that the Receipts since the last General Meeting have amounted to £1,000; that is to say, Donations and Subscriptions, £.834; Interest on Stock, £.166.

£.900 Three per Cent. Consols have been purchased during the year, making the Society's Stock, at this time, to consist of £.4,400 Three per Cents., and £.1,000 Four per Cents., producing £.172 per Annum.

The Committee consider that their duties would be imperfectly performed, were they to omit recording the names of those Contributors to the Fund, who, during the past year, have been conspicuous by their acts of liberality. The accompanying List of Subscribers is so contrived, as to show at one view the whole Receipts of the year. In casting their eyes over it, the attention of Members will probably be drawn to the following Names:—

Lady M^r Grigor, by the additional Sum of Five Pounds, has made up her Subscription to Fifteen Pounds. Mrs. Borland has contributed Ten Guineas. Mrs. Henderson, Mrs. T. Gunning, and Mrs. Bohan, Ten Pounds each. Mrs. Harrington and Mrs. Starkie are Contributors of Five Pounds each.

The Society is doubtless aware that Sir Lucas Pepys, Bart., the Worshipful Company of Apothecaries, and Calvert Clarke, Esq., are Donors to the Fund, of Ten Guineas annually. Dr. Shapter has made a second Donation of £.21. John Lawrie, Esq., Army Agent, and Dr. Moutat, of the 14th Foot, are Contributors to the same amount. Dr. Brown, Inspector of Hospitals at Madras, has transmitted to the Treasurer the Sum of £.37 13s., being a Collection, in aid of the Funds, from the Medical Officers on that Station. Dr. M'Mullen, Deputy Inspector of Hospitals, has presented £.20, and the following Officers are Contributors of Ten Guineas each: Dr. Woolriche (2nd Donation); Dr. Broadfoot; Dr. Sweeny; Dickens Buckle, Esq.; Dr. Baird; Dr. Ingham, 29th; Surgeon Millar, 47th Foot; Surgeon Barlow, 71st; Assistant Surgeon Cotton, 14th Regiment; Surgeon Brown, 45th Regiment; Dr. Browne, H. P.; and Assistant Surgeon Richmond, 4th Dragoons. Sir James M^r Grigor, by a recent Contribution of Five Pounds, has made up his total Donation to Thirty-five Pounds. Mr. Bruce, of the Royal Military College, by the payment of Eight Guineas, has made up his total Subscription to Twenty-one Pounds. Assistant Surgeon Browne, of the 23rd, has contributed £.7 18s.

The following Gentlemen have entitled themselves to the especial Notice of the Subscribers, by expressing their intention of making an Annual Payment of Five Guineas: viz.—

The Committee have the farther satisfaction of reporting, that the Sum of One Hundred and Fifty Pounds, awarded at the last General Meeting, in various proportions, as then stated, among the most helpless of the Orphans of Army Medical Officers, has been duly paid and gratefully received; and the Committee have reason to think that such Assistance has contributed most essentially to their Comfort.

The Committee recommend that the Sum for Distribution, on the present occasion, be limited to Two Hundred Pounds.




