Dear Dr. Preston Maxwell,

In reply to your letter of the 26th ult. to hand this morning.

I am afraid your reply to our original letter, in which you stated
that you would so kindly present the objects which you sent to the
Wellcome Historical Medical Museum, must have miscarried, as we can
find no trace of its receipt.

When we sent you the duplicate of our letter of November 28th, as we had not heard from you, we noticed that at the foot of the criginal form you filled in there was a note asking us to return the objects to your father at Bromley, Kent. We were awaiting your reply to ours of November 28th before doing so, and they have not yet been sent.

I much regret you have had so much trouble about them, but this you will see is owing to the missing letter.

I need hardly say we shall be most pleased to avail ourselves of your kind offer and preserve all the little objects in the Wellcome Historical Medical Museum, where they will be labelled as having been presented by you.
