Dear Sir,

I had great pleasure in saying, in the March and April numbers of our splendid illustrated periodical, Aesculape, how much I thought of your work in general, of the interesting efforts which you have exerted in so many different directions for the good of humanity, and, in particular, the splendid and admirable Museum where you have accumulated so many treasures that one hardly knows what to praise in you most your vast erudition or your astonishing activity.

I was happy to bring to the knowledge of 20,000 doctors in France, all readers, more or less directly, of our medical Review, the details of the beautiful things which you offered to those attending the Congress of London last August.

I hope in this way to have induced numerous colleagues to visit it also, when at a future time you have opened it in its permanent state, for future visitors anxious to complete their documentation upon the facts and customs of the medical past.

I think I must have given satisfaction to you personally, and I only regret one thing, that is that the limited space at my disposal did not permit me to enlarge at length upon the valuable treasures scattered about your collection in such great numbers.

I shall be grateful to you if you will kindly tell me if the Editor of Aesculape has sent you a sufficient number of copies of the two issues which contain the articles in which you are interested.

I thank you personally for the photographic documents which you placed at our disposal.

P.S. If you think I have acquired any claim to your good-will, I allow myself, reminding you that French people are very fond of honorary distinction, to ask you if, on account of my various publications on the Medical Congress in London, and on the W. Medical Historical Museum, it would not be possible for you to arrange for me obtain an English medal or decoration, which I should be very happy and proud to wear, by the side of those which have been given to me already by other countries under similar circumstances.

Translation of letter to Dr. Satre, Grenoble. 4 Dec 1913.

Dear Sir,

Dr. Bord, the principal Editor of "Aesculape" has written to me with reference to your proposed illustrated article in "Aesculape" on the Wellcome Historical Medical Museum in London, and he has asked me to send him all the photographs we can to illustrate it.
