Had the mistake arisen through us, I should have been very willing to have paid for the alteration, but I do not feel called upon to bear any expense in the matter, as you were given the exact dimensions in length and height by myself in your shop. Therefore from no point of view am I responsible for the error. I must therefore decline again to bear any cost in putting the case right. Should you not desire to go on with my further orders, I should be glad if you would let me know at once, so I may place the order elsewhere. If I do not hear from you by return of post, please cancel the order I sent yesterday.

Dear Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 16th inst., with reference to your inquiry re six case covers 10" high x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square inside measurement, the outside measurement of 12 $\frac{1}{4}$ " given at the foot was really a guide to you in case the glass was so thick that it would exceed 12 $\frac{1}{4}$ " outside measurement. That is all it meant. If you make the covers as described 10" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square inside measurement, that will be all right.

I should like some composition put on the bottom edges, as they are not intended to go into a groove, but to simply stand on a shelf.
