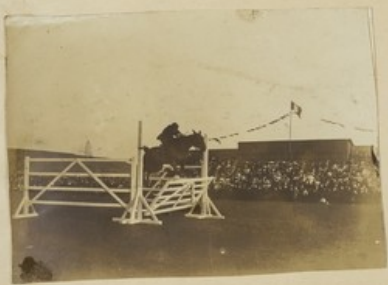



Mr. Malloy was a trooper in the Royal Canadian Dragoons, and was a member of the Canadian contingent in the South African war. He was invalided home early in 1901, having been shot through the head and lost both eyes. He was mentioned in despatches and received the medal for distinguished service in the field.

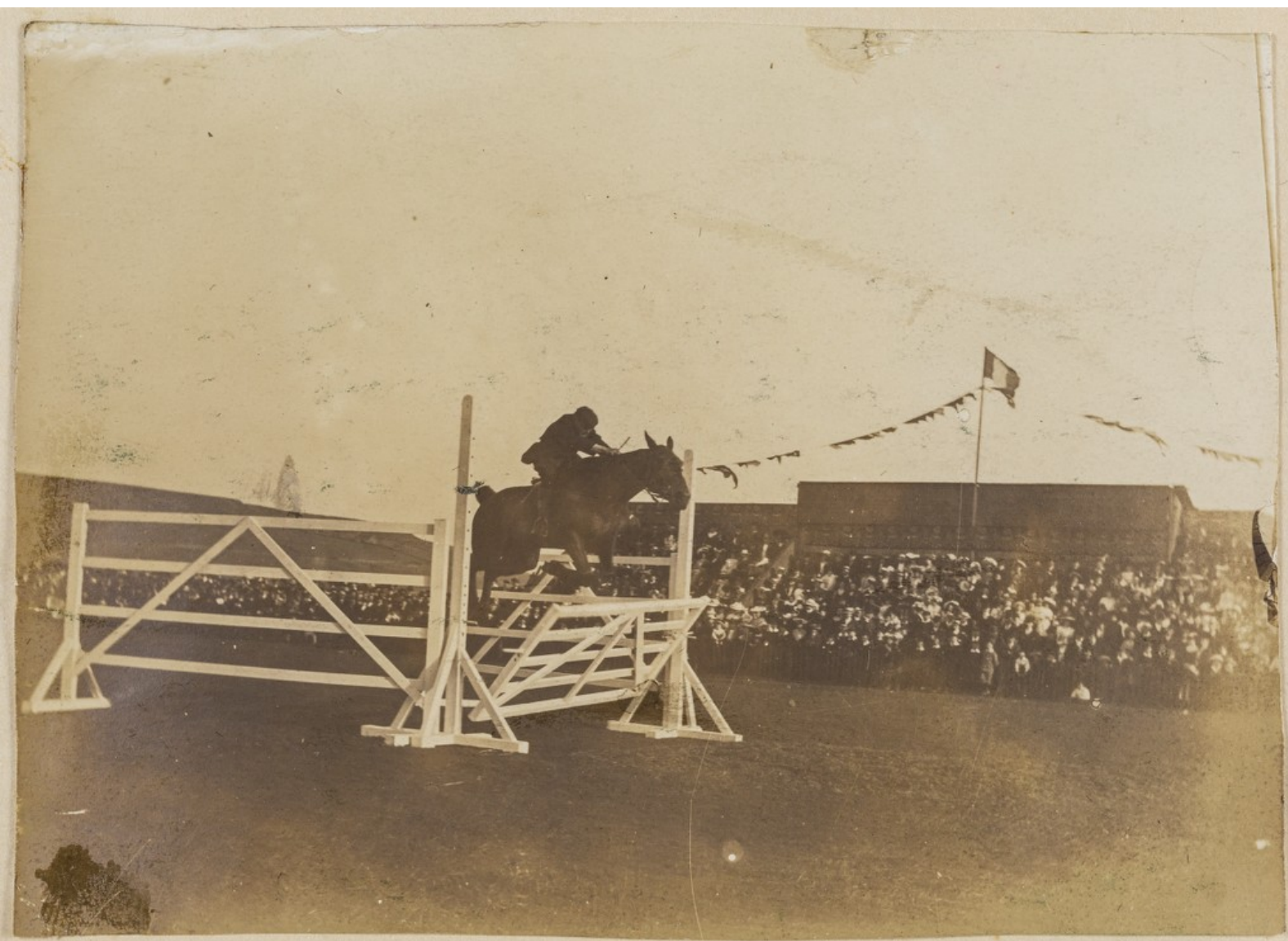

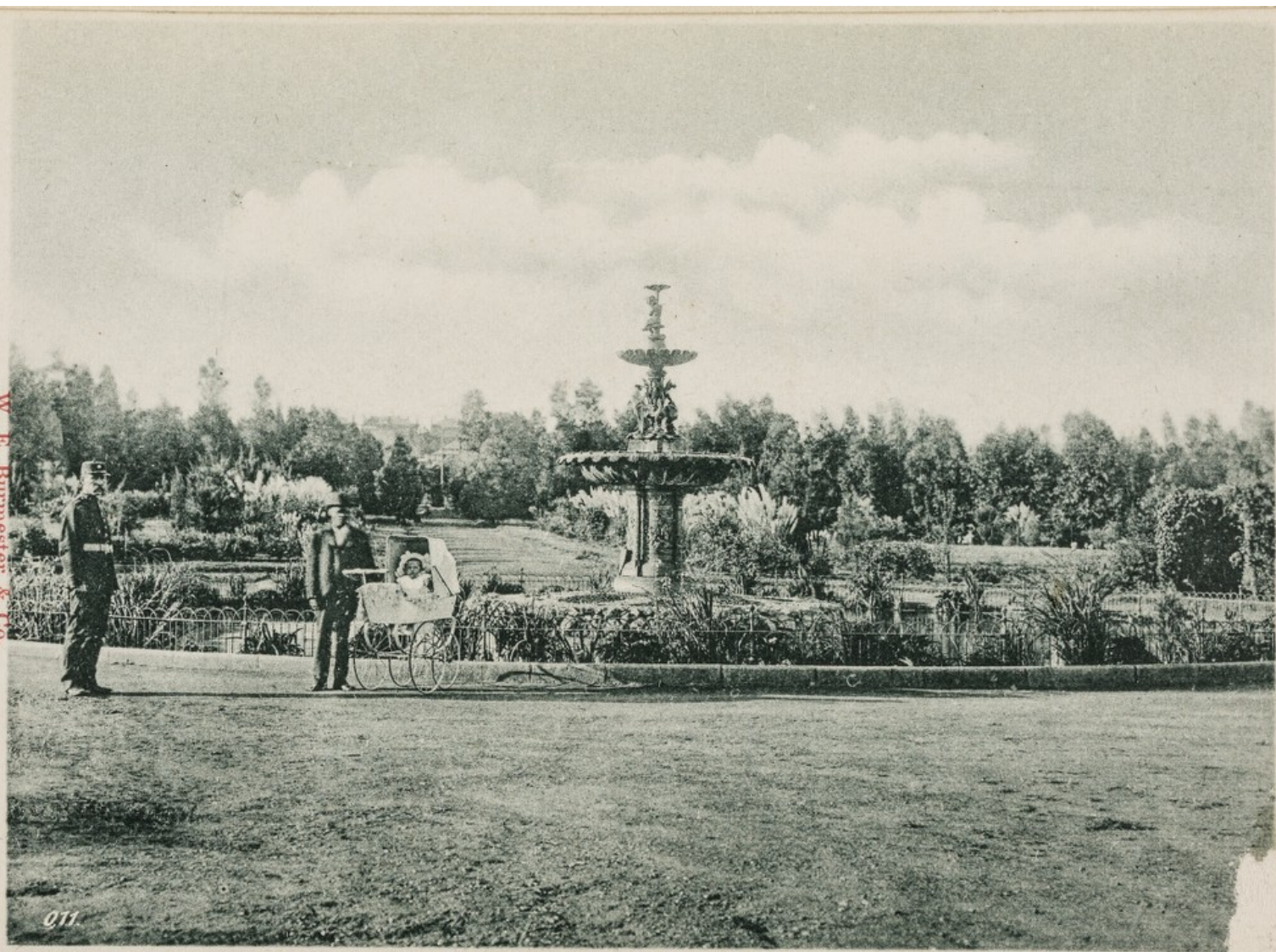

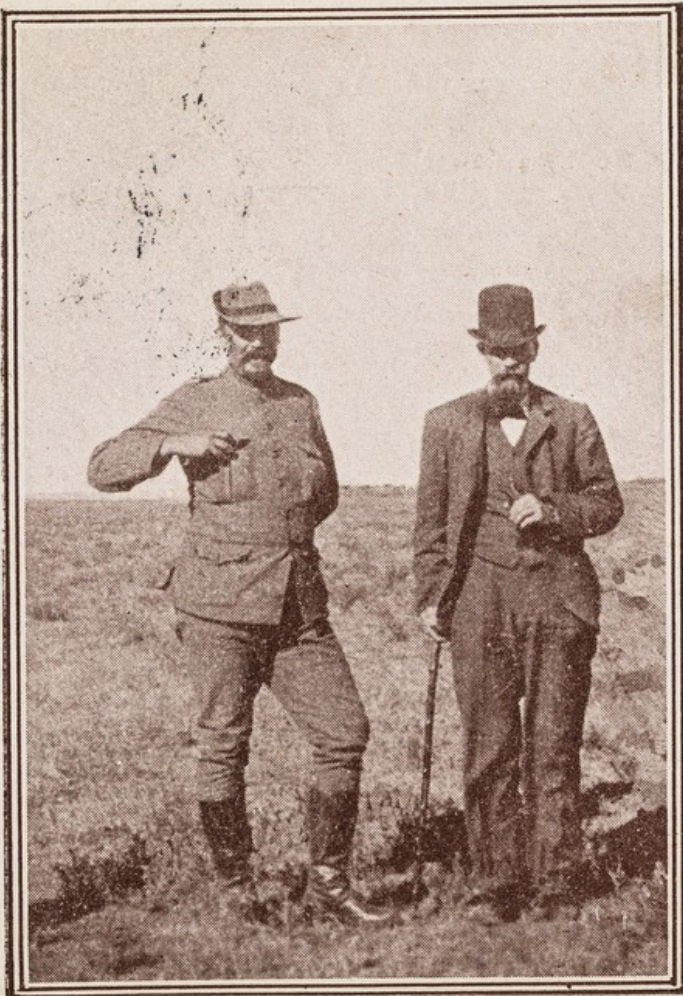
