Ceremonial

To be Observed at the Funeral of

Bis Late Majesty King Edward the Seventh of Blessed Memory, MAY, 20th, 1910.

On Friday, the twentieth day of May, Guards of Honour will be mounted at Westminster Hall and Paddington Railway Station.

At 9.45 o'clock precisely in the morning the royal coffin will be removed from Westminster Hall by an officer and twelve men of the Guards and Household Cavalry, and placed upon a gun carriage, and the Crown and Cushion, the Regalia, and the Insignia of the Garter laid thereon.

The Procession will then move in the following order :-



Minute guns will be fired while the procession moves from Westminster Hall to Paddington Station.

The King, the members of the Royal Family, the royal representatives, with the exception of those whose names appear in the list of occupants of the six royal carriages, the Earl Marshal, and the Master of the Horse, will ride on horseback.

The coffin will be taken from the gun carriage, on the arrival at Paddington Station, by a bearer party of non-commissioned officers of the Guards, and will be placed in the royal train, which will also convey the King and the other royal personages who are taking part in the procession.

AT WINDSOR.

On arriving at Windsor the coffin will be removed from the train by the bearer party of non-commissioned officers of the Guards, and placed upon a gun carriage drawn by a detachment of the men forming the naval guard of honour. The coffin will be covered by a pall of purple velvet and the Royal Standard, on which will rest the cushion and crown, the regalia and insignia of the Order of the Garter.

AT ST. GEORGE'S CHAPEL.

On arrival at the chapel, the Chief of the Imperial General Staff, Adjutant-General Master of Ordnance and Quartermaster-General, aides-de-camp, together with Major-General A. E. Codrington and his staff; will range themselves on either side of the steps leading to the west door of the chapel.

The Pursuivants, Heralds, Lyon and Ulster King of Arms will move up the nave of the chapel, ranging themselves on either side of the entrance to the choir, and Garter King of Arms will pass into the choir to be in readiness to pronounce the styles of his late Majesty.

At the west door of the chapel the royal body will be received by :---

with the canons, minor canons, lay clerks, and choristers of St. George's Chapel. The procession will move up the nave headed by the choir and clergy, and the opening sentences of the Burial Service will be chanted by the choir.

The Gold Sticks and White Staves will proceed on either side of this procession into the choir.

Behind the coffin, which will be immediately preceded by the Earl Marshal, the Lord Steward, and the Lord Chamberlain, will walk the King, the other members of the Royal Family, the royal representatives, and the remainder of the procession; those who have ranged themselves outside the west door falling in after the suites of the special envoys.

His Majesty the King, Chief Mourner, will stand at the Head of the Coffin.

The Lord Chamberlain of his Majesty's Household will take his place at the foot of the coffin.

The lesson will be read by the Bishop of Winchester. The sentence, "I heard a voice from Heaven" will

be read by the Dean of Windsor, and after the Lord's Prayer, the anthem, "How blest are they," will be sung.

The prayers will be read by the Archbishop of Canterbury.

Sir Alfred Scott-Gatty, Garter Principal King of Arms, will pronounce the Styles of his late Most Sacred Majesty of Blessed Memory :---

Thus it hath pleased Almighty God to take out of this transitory life unto His Divine Mercy, the late Most High, Most Mighty, and Most Excellent Monarch, Edward VII., by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, and Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter. "Let us humbly beseech Almighty God to bless with long life, health, and honour, and all worldly happiness, the Most High, Most Mighty, and Most Excellent Monarch, Our Sovereign Lord George, now, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, and Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter."

"God Save the King."

The Anthem, "Blest are the departed," will then be sung, and the Archbishop of Canterbury will pronounce the Benediction.

His Majesty's Bodyguard of the Hon. Corps of Gentlemen-at-Arms will be on duty in the choir of the Chapel, the Yeomen of the Guard being on duty in the Nave.

Sixty-eight minute guns will be fired in the Long Walk at Windsor as the procession leaves Windsor Station.






