However I should like to call your attention to a chapter of Professor De Groot's "Religious System of China" the XIV chapter in Vol. IV Book II, Part I, Page 357 ff, where you will find interesting information concerning Food and Medicines prepared from animals and men. In this chapter you will find amongst other things, that blood, etc, of executed criminals, human hearts, human flesh and gall, human hair, human teeth and nails, human phlegm, saliva and milk, and even placenta, menses, faeces and urine, etc, have been used and are still used as medicines by the Chinese.

I am very sorry I can't send you the book but I am sure you can easily find access to it in the Library of the British Museum in London.
