I desire to thank you for your letter of the 3rd inst., and it is with great pleasure I learn that you are able to lend us the silk banner to have a copy made for this Museum. I will send a responsible messenger for it tomorrow morning who will leave a receipt with the hall-keeper for it. Will you kindly let me know the amount for which you would like it insured? I will put a policy in hand for 2100. upon it at once pending your reply. It shall not leave the premises of the Museum while we have it, and it will be placed every night in a secure place in our strong room. I can assure you that every care will be taken of it while in our possession. I am communicating with an artist about the work of copying which he will have to do in the Museum, and on hearing from him (which I expect will be early next week) I will let you know how long it will take him to do, and return the banner to you at the earliest possible moment.

With respect to the 15th century surgeon's diploma, what I should propose to do with your permission, would be to photograph it first, and then have it engrossed by a good penman on a piece of parchment

of the medical diplomas that we have here from the Lambeth Palace library. With your permission I could send a photographer any morning, who would take the greatest care in photographing it, and the work could then be done by the artist at his own place.
