


By the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India, &c. &c.
 To our Trusty and well beloved William Francis Burnett Esquire Greeting:
 We, reposing especial Trust and Confidence in your Loyalty Ability and good Conduct, do by these Presents Constitute and Appoint you to be Surgeon-Major in Our Land Forces from the thirty-first day of March 1878. You are therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the Duty of Surgeon Major or of such higher Rank as We may hereafter appoint you to, by doing and performing all and all manner of things thereunto belonging. And you are to observe and follow such Orders and Directions from time to time as you shall receive from Us, or any your superior Officer, according to the Rules and Discipline of War, in pursuance of the Trust hereby reposed in you.

In Witness whereof the Officer Commanding in Chief and one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the Order of Her Majesty in Council bearing date the Fifth day of May 1873, and by Command of Her Majesty, under Her Royal Sign Manual of even date herewith, hereunto subscribe their names this twenty-fifth day of April
 One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.
