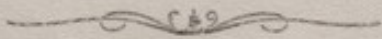

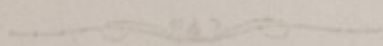

My dear Mackinnon

I wrote to you a short-  
time ago about the termination  
of the essays for the Parbes Memorial  
Inq, & how the ending paper  
lines respecting the state of the  
Fund & what seems best to be  
done regarding it in the future.

For a long time past the Committee  
of which I am Pres<sup>r</sup> & Notter Treas<sup>r</sup>  
have been anxious about the  
termination of the fund, owing  
to the depreciation of the securities  
in which the chief part of the  
money was invested. Moreover it  
was found at the time of de Chambray's



to think that he had overestimated  
(strangely enough) his own degree  
the proceeds of the investments, especially  
of the Calcutta Municipal Bonds.  
It was in consequence of seeing this  
that when the subject of the Prize  
Essay was last announced, instead  
of publishing that a prize of  
100 guineas & a gold medal worth  
15 guineas would be awarded as  
had previously been done, it was  
only stated that 100 guineas & a  
Gold Medal would be given, without  
ascribing any particular value  
to the Medal.

This will be done now to keep  
faith with the writers of the Essay,  
but it cannot be done in the  
future. The Medal will be only  
16 Carat gold instead of 22 Carat

gold, & will be accompanied as  
promised by the 100 guineas. To  
do this however, will trench on the  
Capital of the Fund to the extent  
of £4 or £5 -  
For the next year the Com<sup>tee</sup> propose  
to announce that a sum of  
75 guineas & a gold medal will  
be awarded to the successful  
competitor. This will leave a  
little balance to the good in the  
course of <sup>the</sup> 3 years, & this is only  
a prudent provision as some of  
the investments are in 4% bonds  
(Victoria & New South Wales) & there  
seems to be no doubt they will be  
called in before long & reduced to

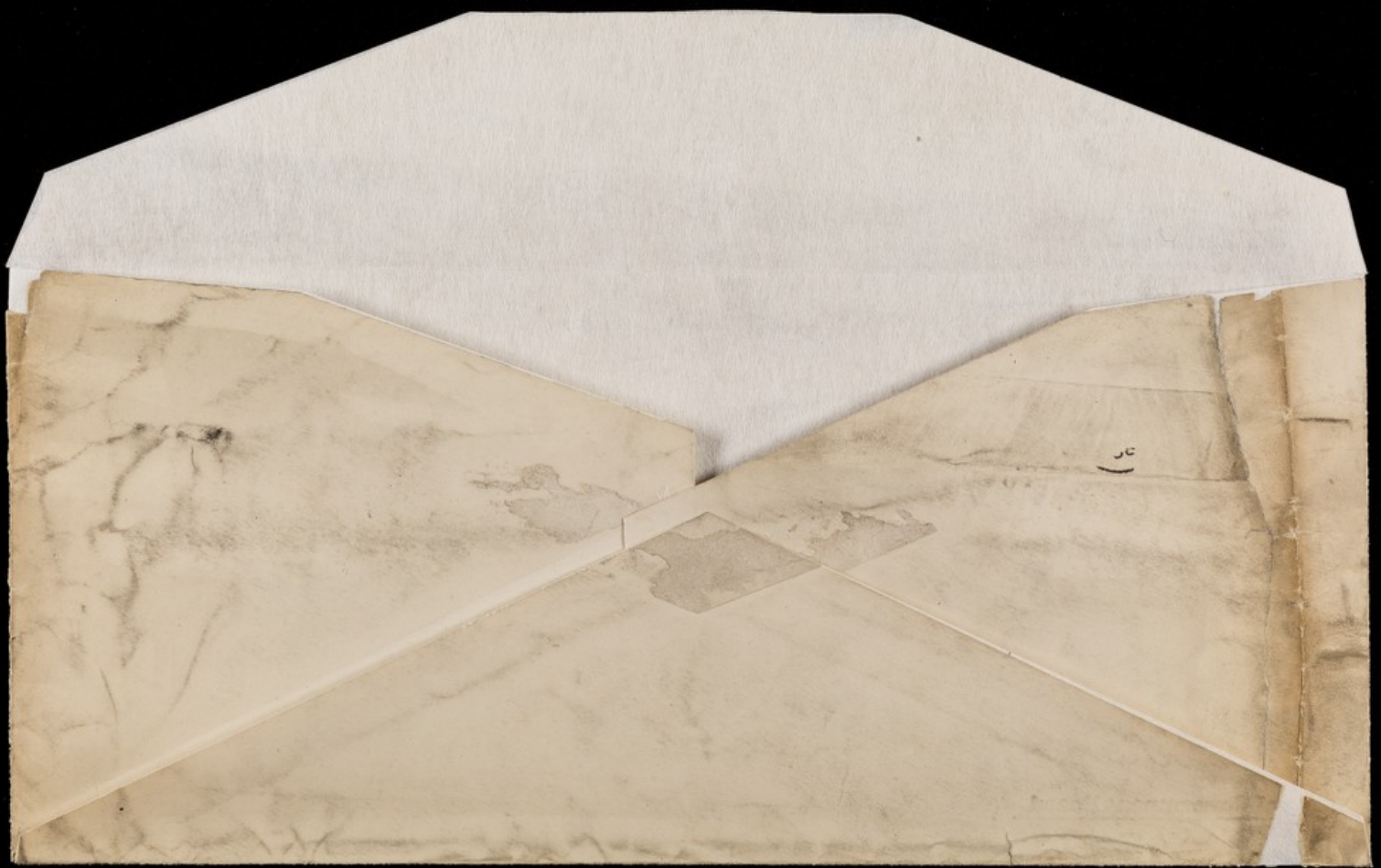

## MEMORIAL TO THE LATE DR. PARKES, F.R.S.

At a meeting of Army Medical Officers, held in the Mess-room at Netley, 20th April, 1876, the Principal Medical Officer in the chair, the following resolutions were unanimously agreed upon:—

I.—Proposed by Surgeon-General LONGMORE, C.B., seconded by Surgeon-General MACLEAN, C.B.—  
“That it is desirable to establish a permanent memorial of the late Dr. Parkes, Professor of Hygiene in the Army Medical School.”

II.—Proposed by Surgeon-Major J. COATES, M.D., seconded by Surgeon-Major G. PAIN—  
“That the memorial consist of a portrait, to be painted by an eminent artist, which should be placed in the Mess-room of the Head-Quarters of the Army Medical Department, whether at Netley or elsewhere; and of a replica of the bust of Dr. Parkes now at University College, to be placed in the Lecture-room of the Army Medical School; and, further, if the fund collected admit of it, the foundation of a Parkes Scholarship, or Prize, to be competed for in the Army Medical School.”

III.—Proposed by Surgeon-Major J. H. PORTER, seconded by Surgeon J. O'REILLY, M.B.—  
“That all Medical Officers in the Army, Naval, and Indian Public Services be requested to subscribe; and that contributions be also received from any other friends and admirers of Dr. Parkes, who may wish to join in the memorial.”
