Copy of a draft letter from Sir William Aitken to Mrs Lewis.

Madam,

I am requested by the Senate of the Army Medical School to forward you a copy of a minute unanimously adopted at its meeting held in London on 17th instant, relative to the death of your husband the late Surgeon Major T.R. Lewis, Assistant Professor of Pathology.

The secretary is sorry to have to report the death of Surgeon Major T.R. Lewis, Assistant Professor of Pathology which took place on 7th May last, shortly after the commencement of the session after a short illness at the age of 44.

The death of Dr. Lewis is a great loss to the Service, to the School and to Science, in intimating to the senate his untimely death the Professors do so with deep regret at the loss of a much loved collegue, who had already made for himself a world wide reputation, especially by his work in India regarding the the Pathology of Cholera and by his original discovery of filariae in the blood of man, and by other researches in kindred subjects, so that the Council of the Royal Society had selected him for the Fellowship in recognition of the high estimation in which his scientific work was held - an honour which Dr. Lewis highly valued.

In forwarding you this extract from the minutes, I am also instructed to convey to you the sincere sympathy of the colleagues of your late husband here at Netley in your great bereavement and none can more feelingly appreciate the very great loss you have sustained than they, who would now mingle their regrets with yours.
