The three cases of gonorrhoea in the 9<sup>th</sup> were received when on patrol in the Zharadaha valley. One was hit in the back - another was shot thro' the flank part of the upper arm - and the 3<sup>rd</sup> in the thigh. The ball passing one thigh and lodging in the other. The men are doing well.
