

Papers of Surgeon General Sir Joseph Jee

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This Indenture made the ninth day of October in
 the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five
 Between Joseph Jee son of Elizabeth Jee of the Town of
 Northampton in the County of Northampton Widow and the said
 Elizabeth Jee of the one part and Robert Inmerant of Baldock in
 the County of Hertford Surgeon and Apothecary and Member of the
 Royal College of Surgeons in England and also of Apothecary's Hall
 in London of the other part Witnesseth that the said Joseph Jee
 of his own free will and good liking and with the consent and approbation of the
 said Elizabeth Jee hath put and placed and by these presents hath put place and
 bind himself apprentice unto and with the said Robert Inmerant to be taught
 and instructed in the art profession or business of a Surgeon and Apothecary
 which he the said Robert Inmerant now useth and to serve him as an apprentice
 for and during the term of five years to commence from the day of the date of
 these presents and fully to be complete and ended During all which time
 the said Joseph Jee hath covenanted and promised to and with the said
 Robert Inmerant that he the said Joseph Jee shall and will
 faithfully serve the said Robert Inmerant by day and by night in the said
 art profession or business of a Surgeon and Apothecary and shall keep the secrets
 and willingly do all the lawful commands of his said Master to the utmost
 of his power and shall not at any time or place do see or hear of his said
 Master's hurt without giving him due notice nor knowingly suffer the same
 to be done and shall not frequent taverns or alehouses nor play at cards dice
 or any other unlawful game Neither shall he marry nor from the service
 of his said Master by day or night absent himself without his leave
 but in all things as an honest and faithful apprentice shall and will
 demean and behave himself towards his said Master and all his during
 all his said Apprenticeship And the said Robert Inmerant in consideration
 of such service and of the sum of One Hundred and Ninety nine pounds
 of lawful money of Great Britain unto him in hand paid by the said
 Elizabeth Jee at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged Doth for himself his heirs executors and
 administrators covenant promise and agree that he the said Robert
 Inmerant shall and will according to the best of his skill and knowledge
 during the said term teach and instruct or cause to be taught and
 instructed the said Joseph Jee to the best of his capacity

in the said Art profession or business of a Surgeon and Apothecary
which he now useth finding and providing for the said Apprentice
sufficient Meat drink board and Lodging during the said Apprenticeship
in a like and equal manner with the rest of his family And also in case
of accident or sickness will provide Medicines and all necessary professional
attendance except a Nurse and the expenses attendand upon her And the
said Elizabeth fee doth hereby for herself her heirs executors and administrators
covenant and agree with the said Robert Innerarity that she the said
Elizabeth fee shall and will at her own costs provide for the said apprentice
necessary clothes and wearing apparel and the washing making and mending
thereof and all other necessaries (except meat drink board and lodging) during
all the said term of five years And the said Robert Innerarity Doth
for himself his heirs executors and administrators covenant and agree
that he will at the expiration of the said term use his best endeavours
at the request and costs of the said Apprentice and Elizabeth fee
or either of them or the executors or administrators of the said Elizabeth
fee to procure the said Apprentice to be duly admitted a Surgeon
and Apothecary qualified to practise And further that in case the said
Robert Innerarity shall die before the expiration of the said term of
five years his executors and administrators shall pay unto the said
Elizabeth fee her executors or administrators such proportion of the said
sum of One hundred and ninety nine pounds as follows that is to say
In case the said Robert Innerarity shall die before the end of one year
from the date hereof the sum of ninety nine pounds And after one year
and before two years from the date hereof the sum of Eighty pounds
And after two years and before three years from the date hereof
the sum of Fifty pounds And after three years and before four years
from the date hereof the sum of thirty pounds And in case of such
decease of the said Robert Innerarity before the end of the said term
of five years his executors and administrators shall with all convenient
speed at the request and costs of the said ^{fee} and
Elizabeth fee her executors or administrators assign the said
apprentice unto some other Surgeon ^{and} apothecary to be named by
the said Elizabeth fee her executors or administrators for the
residue of the said term of five years or for such other term as

will be necessary to enable the said Apprentice to get admitted a
surgeon and apothecary And for the true performance of all and every
the covenants and agreements aforesaid each and every of the said
parties their heirs executors and administrators in the sum of One
hundred and ninety nine pounds of lawful money aforesaid bindeth
himself herself and themselves to the other and others of them jointly
by these presents as liquidated and ascertained damages In

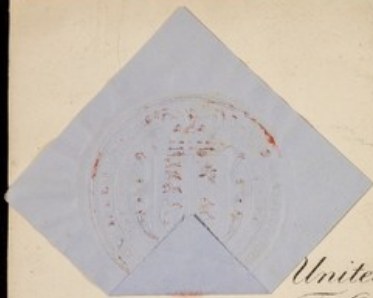

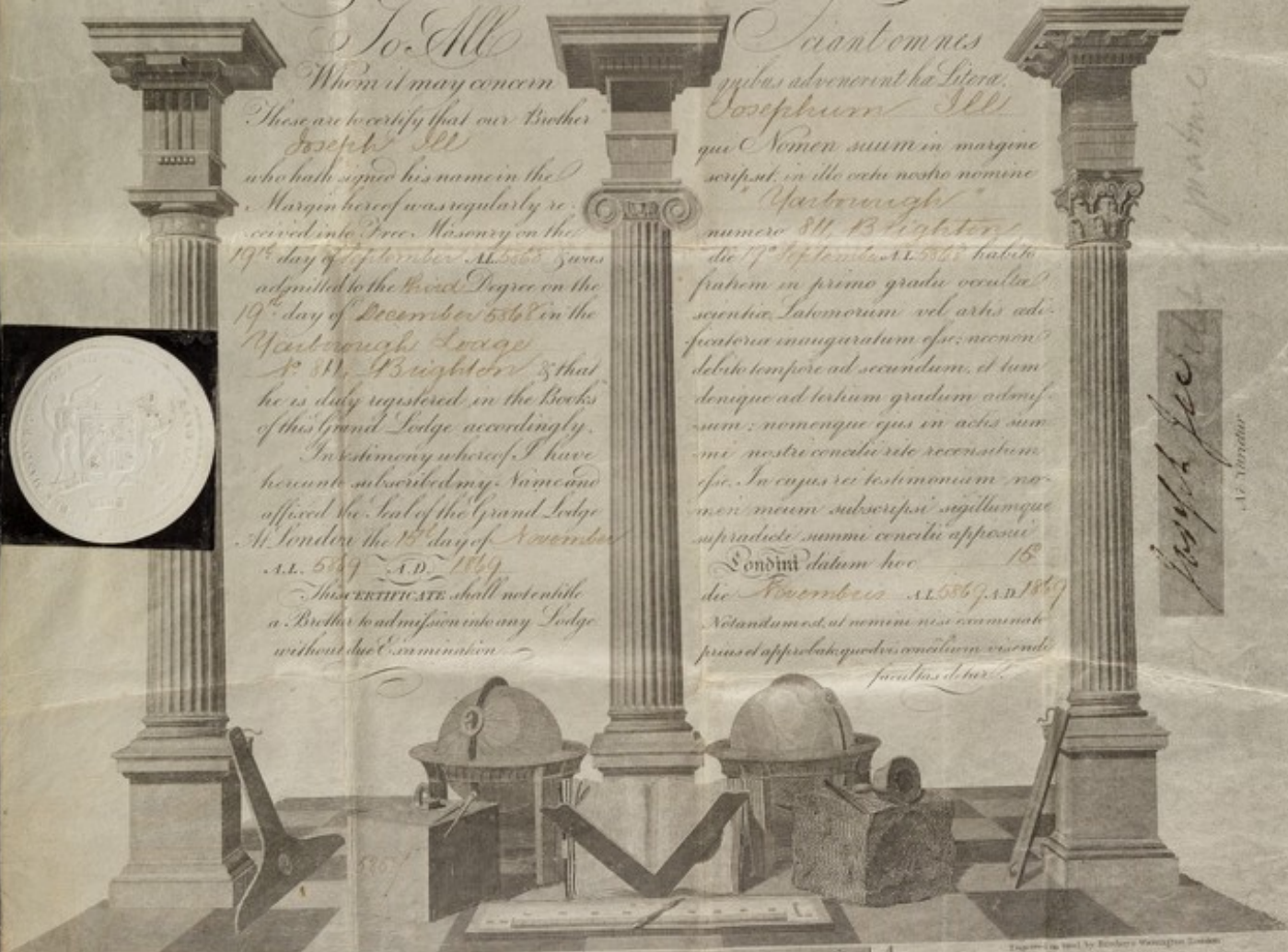
