You are to attend the private people,
Artificers and others as well as the Officers belonging to
the Train at all Hours and Times when called upon, to
Administer proper Medicines and perform all necessary
Operations for their relief according to the best of your
Skill and Judgement; and according to the Orders and
Directions you shall receive from the Surgeon to the said
Train.

You are not to sell or Dispose of any of the said
Medicines provided for the sole Use of the said Train, nor
to Convert them to private Use on any pretence whatsoever
nor suffer it to be done, so far as it may be in your power
to prevent the same; otherwise you will and shall be
Cashed for such Offence.

You are to follow all such Orders and
Directions as you shall receive from the Master General
Lieutenant General and principal Officers of the
Ordnance for the time being, the Commanding Officer
