1 There is a debt of £46569. 14 ^q owing to the Director for
Officers Gallerys & the expence of the Hospitall at Norlingen
in Germany by which he is so great a looser that y^e interest
amounts to halfe the Capitall since he has been out of
this money —

2 He and Mr Teale have onely receivd £54937. 10 ^q on
acc^t the expence 1711. so that theres still due for that
Service £131520. 14 ^q as appears by her Majestys
Warrant and the Declaration of Mr Ince. —

3 Your Grace when in Flanders was pleased to write
the Lrd Treasurer for a supply to carry on the Service
of the Hospitall the Campaigne 1712. accordingly after a
delay of three or four months there was a payment of
£90000 ^q made by the Deputy Paymaster abroad so y^t
there remains to compleat the whole charge £66118.
6 ^q excepting the Hospitall at Dunkirke, the
Establisment whereof was ordered by your Grace &
Gen^l Hill in Aug^r last and has been carried onto this
time by Mr Hudson and Dec^r Coatsworth entirely
upon their owne credit, not having receivd any
money on acc^t either for Officers Gallerys or the
expence, which has been very great especially at the
beginning having had for some time considerable
numbers in y^e Hospitall & notwithstanding the
applications yet made they have not been able to
procure any reliefe or a certainty when they may
expect so reasonable a Demand, which if much
longer delayd must certainly cause their utter Ruine.

A State of money due to Mr. Hudson

1. There is a debt of 46569 guilders 14 stivers oweing to the Director for Officers Sallerys and the expense of the Hospitall at Norlingen in Germany by which he is so great a looser that ~~the interest~~ amounts to halfe the Capitall since he has been out of this money.
2. He and Mr. Teale have onely received 54937 guilders 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ stivers on account the expence 1711 so that there is still due for that service 131520 guilders 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ stivers as appears by her Majestys Warrant and the Declaration of Mr. Sweete.
3. Your Grace when in Flanders was pleased to write the Lord Treasurer for a supply on the Service of the Hospitall the Campaigne 1712 accordingly after a delay of three or four months there was a payment of 90000 guilders made by the Deputy Paymasters abroad so there remains to compleat the whole charge 661118 guilders 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ stivers excepting the Hospitall at Dunkirke, the establishment whereof was ordered by your Grace and Gentlemen. Hill in August last and has been carried on to this time by Mr. Hudson and Doctor Coatsworth entirely upon their own credite, not haveing received any money on account either for Officers Sallerys or the expence, which has been very great especially at the beginning haveing had for some time considerable numbers in your Field Hospitall and notwithstanding the applications yet made they have not been able to procure any relief of a certainty when they may expect so reasonable a Demand, which if much longer delay'd must certainly cause their utter ruin.
