Dear Sir, We are arranging a special exhibition of objects connected with Naval and Military Surgery, Nursing and Ambulance in this Museum, which I hope to have ready about the middle of next month. We have already gathered some interesting medical relics of famous Maval and Military men, including Lord Melson's medicine chest, the Duke of Wellington's medicine chest, and surgical instruments and other relies of Dr. Gillespie, Physician-General to Lord Nelson's Fleet, several miniatures and autograph letters of Miss Florence Nightingale, and many other relies of Mursing and Ambulance used in the Crimean War. I wish to know if you could assist us by obtaining permission to lend for this exhibition a few of the Red Cross Orders that were bestowed on Miss Nightingale, and also a small model of a field ambulance wagon that you have in the Royal United Service Institution.
