It was only at the urgent wish of Dr Sambon that I was induced to make you the offer of further work. The price fixed was an adequate one and accepted by you at the time, although your latter work has not given me satisfaction; of course now the work will be carried out by others on our staff of artists.

Dear Sir,

Allow me to say that your letter just received is a most illogical one and I am now going to say why.

First of all in your letter of the 28th Jan. you say you wanted to see me "with reference to the painting of another large picture." So that I thought you meant the third of the three large pictures (about 5 feet square each) for which Mr Wellcome sent me three sketches.

When I saw Mr Wellcome about them, before he put the matter in your hands, seeing that he did not want to spend

you send for the 3rd Sketcher and the rest of drawing paper? Really Mr Thompson it seemed most indicative of you, but of course I thought that you were not inclined to give me other thing to do.

Now as you wanted to see me for the third large picture and you did not mention other drawings I thought I had the right to refuse to do it. (I mean the large picture)

Had you written about the large picture and the rest of small drawings I should have then been pleased to work for Mr wellcome.

Therefore you see your last two letters are in perfect contradiction, so much so that Dr Saubon's urgent work that you should give me further work is not mentioned in your letter of the 28th Jan. last.

Dr Saubon has acquired good deal of taste and he is able to

understand artistic work and knows what my work is worth, but allow me to say that your words "Although your latter work has not given me Satisfaction," are quite out of place. You really cannot say then especially that Dr Saubon was present when I brought my last few drawings (the large picture included) and what is more important you found very little on them to be altered.

Had they been unsatisfactorily done you would surely have then returned them to me and refused ^{to pay them} or asked me to alter them.

Is my letter very clear to you? I hope it is.

Dear Sir,

In reply to yours of the 2nd inst., your remarks concerning the matter of the pictures have not made your point by any means clear to me, as they are largely incorrect.

I cannot agree that Mr Wellcome ever promised that you should make copies of the entire number of photographs that Dr Sambon took when with you in Italy, a matter in which Dr Sambon also bears me out.

With respect to the large picture, I was present when you agreed to execute the three for Mr Wellcome at four guineas (£4.4.0) each.

It was at your own wish that I had the third stretcher for the picture you had not executed and the rest of the drawing paper removed. You will doubtless remember stating that you were moving and there was a chance of it being soiled, and perhaps damaged. You should not have assumed that I was not inclined to give you more work on that account.

I am also correct in re-stating that your latter work has not given me satisfaction. For instance, the last drawings that you brought down a few days before I left England, in October, are so inferior to your previous work, that when I showed them to Dr Sambon the other day he could not believe that you had executed them, and stated that the colouring was not at all like the originals. I accepted them from you of course subject to Dr Sambon seeing them, and saying that they were correct. In fact, I had fully intended asking you to alter them on my return.

The other assertions made in your letter are scarcely worth replying to, as you quite misrepresent the position of affairs.

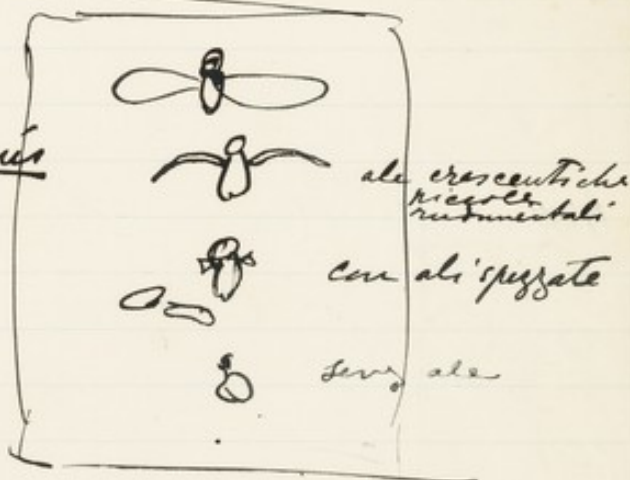
