Whereas we received an Order of the 24 of December 1653 requiring us to present a short State  
of the Authorisites by which we are, as also what the Revenue under our managment doth amount  
unto, and how the same is set by; together with the number of Officers and their respective Salaries  
in pursuance whereof we humbly certify as followeth: 1

That the late Councell of State by 2 sevral orders taken date the 31 of May 1653, the 21 of July and the  
21 of August followinge were pleased to constittute us with other persons therein named or any  
or more of us to be a Committee to take into consideration of condition of Hospitals of St. Iarey and Ely  
hous: both in respect to the numbers and qualities of sick and maimed men and also of us  
persons who are maintained from them and to allowancis made and cominge  
intowards the re lief of such as were sent to these houses for cure, and upon a full information  
gained of these and such other particulars as were proper for our knowledge in order to a better  
settling of said said houses, we or any five or more of us were to provide to a thorough & perfect  
regulation: that these houses in such a way and maner as we should finde to be just and fit,  
and that such persons and such only might be received in for cure there and relieved from them as  
should be found upon a due examination of their statt and condicione to stand in need of, and deserve  
help and relief from the publicke: That by an Order of his Highnesse the Lord  
Protector to us directed bearing date 1<sup>st</sup> of October 1653 we were authoris'd to choose out of this  
nation and from time to time out of such patients as should be discharged by a physician or  
chirurgeon all such who were not wholly disabled by wounds or sickness contracted in ye service  
whom we were to send to y<sup>e</sup> general hospitals pertayning in England, Scotland or Ireland,  
whiche either they themselves shoule choose or we think best to appoint allowing them  
so much to bear their charges by y<sup>e</sup> way as shoule bee convenient more or lesse accordinge  
their ability to travell or distanc of place we shoule dispose them to; provided that y<sup>e</sup>  
number we shoule send shoule not exceed twenty to fiftyn on any hundred; and by  
Order of y<sup>e</sup> Count Aaring date the 6<sup>th</sup> of October and the 19<sup>th</sup> of November 1654 we are impowered  
to allow y<sup>e</sup> pension to such persons returned from Germany as are incapable of future  
service by reason of infalitie, wounds and shottes received in his Highnesse service in y<sup>e</sup> w<sup>th</sup>  
warre and that shoule be recommended to us by the Com: for chirurgen and also by y<sup>e</sup> w<sup>th</sup>  
of such Scoulds as left their servis in the said Service and are or shall bee recommended to  
us by y<sup>e</sup> said Com: That in pursuance of an Order of his Highnesse and Councell  
bearing date 1<sup>st</sup> of September 1654, and sevral orders of y<sup>e</sup> Councell dated the 15<sup>th</sup> of  
27<sup>th</sup> of October and 3<sup>rd</sup> of December followinge were laste proceeded and continued in the  
managment of y<sup>e</sup> affaires of both Hospitals since y<sup>e</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> of July last according to the  
powers and intitutions given to us as aforesaid; That by an Order of his Highnesse  
and Councell dated the 4<sup>th</sup> of May 1654 the named Scoulds w<sup>th</sup> coats and traphairys  
were allowed to have out of y<sup>e</sup> Exchequer obidit the aloyalty of ffints & for fforfities  
amounting to 1000 p<sup>ds</sup> or upwards that shone was likewise by a former Indenture of  
parliment 230 p<sup>ds</sup> to be paid for y<sup>e</sup> use of sick and maimed Scoulds out of Goldsmiths  
Hous: which together with y<sup>e</sup> said 500 is 735 p<sup>ds</sup> to pay y<sup>e</sup> ffints and fforfities  
of y<sup>e</sup> Exchequer whiche was allowed over and above y<sup>e</sup> said 735 p<sup>ds</sup> woolles; that by Letter  
patents dated the 18<sup>th</sup> of November 1654, 735 p<sup>ds</sup> woolles was appointed to bee paid out of his  
Highnesse Exchequer for y<sup>e</sup> use aforesaid but the ffints and fforfities in y<sup>e</sup> said Letter  
patents were not insisted nor any allowance granted in lieu of same, because y<sup>e</sup> ffint  
and fforfities could not bee exacted by certaintie: That the  
said 735 p<sup>ds</sup> of letters patent be now payable to y<sup>e</sup> Procuror of y<sup>e</sup> Navy, the  
Com: of y<sup>e</sup> Admiralty and Navy by breake of two Hilights and y<sup>e</sup> Councell bearing date  
y<sup>e</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> of May 1656 were therfore required to give bid to y<sup>e</sup> said Procuror to pay

Upon reading of a letter from Commission wth Francis  
 Bacon Esq; one of his Highness Ministers of Regiments touching  
 powntions belonging to the Rte of Chatram dated the 6th  
 of Aprill instant Ordered that it be referred to the Comit  
 and Admiralty and Navy to take rwo that some person or persons  
 be given to the said powntions and to offer unto the Comit  
 what they shall think fit in order to their future solvency.

 former Salary as Commissiones for sick and wounded Seaman, and  
 likewise that therell be entituled unto further Order the severall  
 officers hereafter named with thair Salaries byt
