DIRECTIONS FOR THE USE OF CALF LYMPH.

Pass a Knife around the "Tablet" and remove the wax; the point then inserted between the glasses will readily separate them.

If the Lymph be found somewhat dry, a drop or two of water will render it workable.

In vaccinating, keep the liquid and solid portions of the lymph mixed.

If the Lymph be not used immediately on receipt, it should be kept in a "Cool and Dark" place. In "Hot Weather" it should be kept in a Refrigerator.

The colour in Calf Lymph is quite unobjectionable.

NOTICE.

To avoid unsatisfactory results from Calf Lymph (*which possesses slight keeping powers*), please do not indent for more than can be used in one month.

If Lymph be urgently required, a telegram will always ensure some being sent by return of post.

The "Receipt Voucher" should be signed and returned at once.

The Result of Vaccinations should reach this Institute not later than two months from date of issue of the Lymph.

All Requisitions and Receipts for Lymph, also Result of Vaccinations, should be enclosed in an envelope (*and not returned in the box*), addressed to The District Veterinary Officer, Aldershot.

All Boxes should be returned as soon as possible, addressed to The Officer-in-Charge, Army Vaccine Institute, Aldershot.
