THIN REPLY CARDS:—1d. each; packet of twelve Cards, 1s. Bearing 1d. stamp on each half, 2d. each.

Nothing may be attached, except adhesive stamps in payment of additional postage, and a gummed label (not to exceed two inches long and three-quarter inches wide), bearing the address at which the card is to be delivered.

#### POSTAGE STAMPS

Are now issued for the following amounts:—½d., 1d., 1½d., 2d., 2½d., 3d., 4d., 5d., 6d., 7d., 9d., 10d., 1s., 2s. 6d., 5s., 10s. and 20s.; these stamps are also available for Telegrams.

#### STAMPED ENVELOPES.

Envelopes with embossed stamps are issued by the Post Office:—Bearing half-penny stamps (for book post), in two sizes; bearing penny stamps in two sizes. A small charge is made for the envelopes in addition to the value of the stamps.

#### NEWSPAPERS.

For every single newspaper, duly registered at the General Post Office, the postage is 3d. If several are sent together, the packet is not liable to a higher rate than would be chargeable on a book packet or a letter of the same weight, but no parcel must exceed 2 ft. by 1 ft. by 1 ft., or weigh above 5 lbs.

### BOOK POST.

Packets not exceeding 2 oz. in weight (if open at the ends or in an unfastened envelope) may be sent for  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. If exceeding 2 oz. they pass unconditionally at the same rate as letters.

### PARCEL POST.

The postage must be prepaid, and by stamps affixed to the parcel, which must not be put in a letter box, but handed over the office counter.

Rates:—Not exceeding 1 lb., 3d.; 2 lb., 4d.; 3 lb., 5d.; 5 lb., 6d.; 7 lb., 7d.; 8 lb., 8d.; 9 lb., 9d.; 10 lb., 10d.; 11 lb., 11d. Limit of weight allowed, 11 lb.

Compensation for damage or loss of parcels to the amount of £2 without extra charge.

Parcels must not exceed 3 ft. 6 ins. in length, or 6 ft. in length and girth combined.

### EXPRESS DELIVERY OF LETTERS AND PARCELS.

Letters and Parcels are now accepted at Post Offices in London, to be forwarded immediately by Messenger direct to any part of the London Postal area, at the following rate:—For every mile or part of a mile, 3d. Special conveyances will be used if specially paid for, but not otherwise. All charges must be prepaid in postage stamps, to be affixed to a Post Office form provided for the purpose.

In the Provinces such Letters, &c., are accepted at all Post Offices from which there is a delivery of telegrams, and they are delivered in any part of the town or rural district.

### TELEGRAPH RATE (INLAND).

Sixpence for first 12 words, and one halfpenny for every additional word. Postage stamps are used as payment, but must be affixed to the message forms.

### INLAND MONEY ORDERS.

The commission on the issue of Inland Money Orders is as follows:—Amounts not exceeding £1, 2d.; £3, 3d.; £10, 4d.; £20, 6d.; £30, 8d.; £40, 10d. No order can be issued which contains a fractional part of a penny.

Forms of application for Money Orders are supplied at all Money Order offices gratis.

Although a Money Order, if still unpaid at the end of twelve months becomes legally void, nevertheless, when a good reason can be given for the delay in presenting it, an application for payment, subject to a certain deduction, is entertained.

After once paying a Money Order, by whomsoever presented, the office is not liable to any further claim.

### TELEGRAPH MONEY ORDERS (INLAND).

Money may be transmitted by Telegraph Money Order between all Offices in the United Kingdom authorised to transact Telegraph and Money Order business. The Commission is at the same rate as for ordinary Inland Money Orders, plus a supplementary fee of 2d. and cost of Official Telegram of advice. No order issued above £40.

### POSTAL ORDERS

Are issued at all Money Order Offices for any sum from 6d. to 21s., increasing by 6d. The Commission chargeable is, for Orders up to 2s. 6d. inclusive,  $\frac{1}{2}$ d.; from 3s. to 15s. inclusive, 1d.; from 15s. 6d. to 21s. inclusive, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ d.; by the use of not more than three stamps to the total value of 5d. affixed to the face of the order, any broken amount may be made up.

### SAVINGS BANK.

Accounts can be opened and money paid in and withdrawn at any Money Order Office in the United Kingdom.

No less sum than 1s. is received as deposit, but forms can be obtained on which twelve 1d. stamps can be placed, and when filled paid into the Savings Bank as a deposit. No person may deposit more than £50 in any one year ending 31st December, or more than £200 in all, inclusive of interest, which is allowed at the rate of 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. per annum. When principal and interest together exceed £200, interest is allowed on £200 only.

### FOREIGN AND COLONIAL MAILS.

#### RATES OF POSTAGE.

LETTERS:—The charge for letters to British Possessions generally, and to Egypt and the United States, is 1d. the ounce. To all other places 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for the first ounce, and 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for each additional ounce.

POST CARDS (SINGLE):—1d.

PRINTED PAPERS (NEWSPAPERS, BOOKS, &c.):— $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per 2 ounces.

COMMERCIAL PAPERS:— $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per 2 ounces, with minimum charge of 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ d.

PATTERNS AND SAMPLES:— $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per 2 ounces, with minimum charge of 1d.

REGISTRATION FEE:—2d.

Letters posted unpaid, or insufficiently prepaid, to any country where prepayment is compulsory are returned to the writers.

Unpaid letters to or from all places abroad are charged double the prepaid rate. Partially prepaid letters are charged with double the deficiency.



No letter for a Colony or Foreign Country may exceed 2 feet in length or 1 foot in width or depth.

Single and Reply Post Cards are transmissible to all parts of the world. Single Cards are issued with impressed stamps of 1d.; and Reply Cards bearing stamps of the value of 1d. on each half.

Inland Post Cards are also transmissible abroad if the additional postage required is supplied by postage stamps being affixed.

Foreign Money Orders are charged as follows:—For sums not over £1, 3d.; £2, 6d.; £4, 9d.; £6, 1s.; £8, 1s. 3d.; £10, 1s. 6d.

### MARRIAGE LICENCES, &c.

Marriage Licences may be procured in London at the Faculty Office, at the Vicar-General's Office, and at the Bishop of London's Registry, in Doctors' Commons; between 10 and 4, by one of the contracting parties. In the country, at the Bishop's Registrar's Offices, but these only allow the parties to be married in the diocese in which they are issued; those procured at the Faculty Office or at the Vicar-General's Office can be made out for any part of the country.

Special Licences are granted by the Archbishop of Canterbury through the Faculty Office, Doctors' Commons. The fees payable for licence stamp, &c., are about £30.

**MARRIAGE BY BANNS.**—If the contracting parties reside in different parishes or districts, the publication must be made in the churches of each district or parish, for three consecutive Sundays, and the marriage must take place in one of the churches wherein the Banns have been published within three months of the third time of publication, or the Banns become void.

Marriages can be solemnised in places of worship belonging to other denominations than the Church of England, when the building has been duly licensed.

**CIVIL MARRIAGES** can be performed before a duly licensed Registrar. Particulars can be obtained at all Registry Offices.

### REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

**BIRTHS.**—By an Act passed in 1874, it is enacted that parents must register every birth within 42 days of the date thereof, at the Registrar's Office for the district in which they reside. In default, the Registrar is empowered to compel their attendance at his Office, and to charge extra fees.

**DEATHS.**—Deaths must be registered within five days unless a notice with medical certificate has been sent to the Registrar. The nearest relatives of the deceased, present at death, are liable to a penalty for neglect of this regulation.

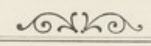

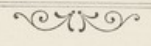

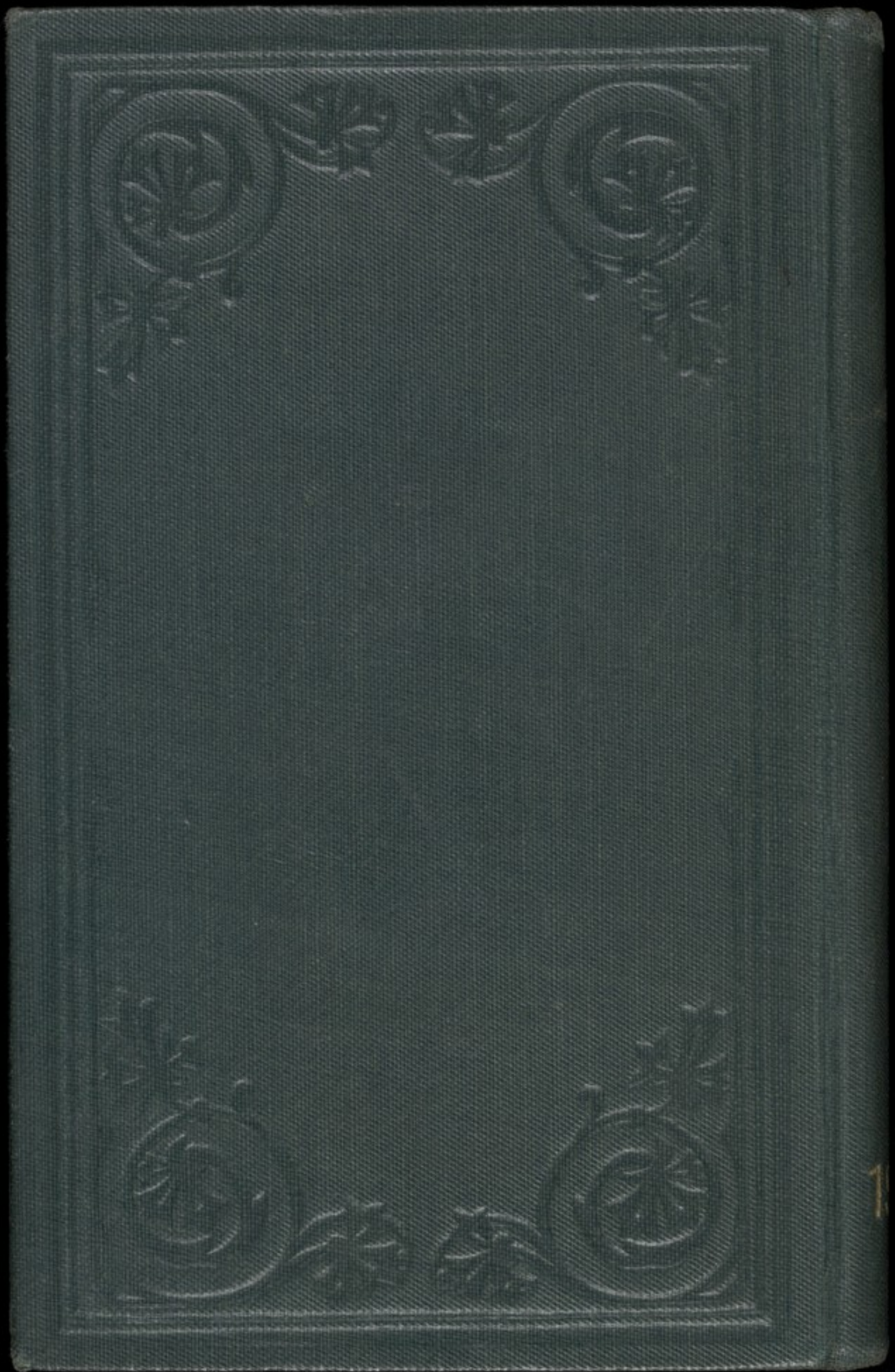
