All articles of uniform except book which must be of regulation pattern) are necessarily - supplied at the Royal Melitary College after the arrival of the Cadet, and not to be procured else-the where, but any badet who may be in the ______ Melitia at the time of his passing the examination may bring his possing the examination may bring his possers, pahol-jacket, great-coat

great-coal and cap with a view to their being altered and made available if formed to be in sufficiently good state. The respect to money allowances made to leadets, Sam desired by the Governor to state that considering the age of the badets, he must leave it entirely to the discretion of their Parents or Guardians to give them that which they think adapted to their future prospects in life merely observing that extravagance as badets will lead to extravagant habits as Officers and that it is not disirable they should, while in a state of tuition have large sums of money at their disposal but whatever the allowances may be it is to be clearly understood to be an affair between the leadet and his friends, and the bollege authorities have nothing to do with it.

I may add that all abolite wants and necessaries are provided at the bollege out of the sum allowed by the Regulations including uniform, books to, bedroom actual requisites (except towels), all meals including beer the Servants are paid by the Rublic.

Sam further desired to irrepress repore you that the entire sum required as a contribution by the Paymaster is paid over to the Government and that the sum of \$\frac{1}{250}\$ demanded by me in this letter for uniform, books, contingent expenses to, does not allow of any advance to badets for havelling expenses. All sums required by badets for havelling from this bollege must be furnished to the badet direct by the Parent or Juardian in time to admit of their leaving at baster on mednesday before Good Friday and on the days the terms end, viz. July 15th and December 15th.

As it is not desirable that youngmen should go feely to London, or anywhere else, from the bollege, I am desired by the Governor to request that you will inform me whether you wish your word to be given leave of absence occasionally for Saturday and Lunday & that if so you will send me a list of the friends and their addresses whom you may wish him to visit when he gets leave after parade on Saturday to the Lunday evening. In the absence of such list your word will not be allowed to absent him self from the boilege.

No Coadet is allowed to bring doys with him to the College under any presence.

No horse or pony is allowed to be kept by a badet unless at the written request of parent or quardian. If a badet intends to play polo or hunt the written sanction from his parent or quardian must also be given So air-guns, pistols, or firearms of any des-cription are allowed to be kept by badets during their residence at this bollege. Your word has been posted to a particular room and Division which will be com-

-lar room and Division which will be communicated to him on arrival here. No alteration can be made unless under most exceptional circumstances.
