

## **Notes on medical cases**

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## Injection of Kodis Fluid in Cases of Leprosy

At Gantie Hongkong on March 22<sup>nd</sup> I injected seven Lepers in various stage of the disease with 0.1 Kodis fluid.

On March 23<sup>rd</sup> of the seven four had an increase of temperature as follows 99.6. 100.5. 101.3. 101.5.

Of the other three had low temperature 97. 97.3. 97.5.

March 25<sup>th</sup> I again injected six of the seven lepers with the strength of the solution. In the evening four had fever increased respectively to the previous temperatures 101.6. 102. 102.3. 103.4. The other two had low temperature 97. 97.3. two of the same as had low temperature in the morning.

March 24<sup>th</sup>

The temperature in each of the case that had accession had fallen & the temperature of the two who had depression was raised.

By the fourth day all had normal temperatures

On March 27<sup>th</sup> I again injected one of the lepers at 9. A.M. at 1.30 p.m. temperature had risen to 99.8. at 5.30 p.m. the temperature was 104.3. I did not see this patient next day. but upon the following morning the temperature was 99.7. so far as I have yet observed the following patients are plain:

1 Lepers far advanced i.e. with depression it may be that these patients had fever which had passed off before I saw them. but from enquiries

I do not think this to have been the case.

2. That in early cases such as facial macula in limbs the temperature increased the spots became much more red.
3. That the blood of all the lepers showed bacilli after the operation which they did not profess before but as to the nature of which I have not yet determined.

Small intestine, near liver end appeared thickened. No ulcers found. Sigmoid flexure & descending colon distended, - rest of intestine full.





This case is worthy of mention as 8 days is recorded as the maximum period of incubation hitherto.

The onset of the Disease is markedly pronounced <sup>febrile</sup> disturbance. Headache, ~~loss of taste~~, ~~loss of taste~~, painful clicking in the limbs & ~~feverish~~ accompanied by vomiting & general loss of energy suddenly compel the patient to seek his bed. The face becomes flushed, the thirst intense, the skin burning hot & dry at the hands, & feet cold. Within 2 or 3 hours the patient becomes <sup>apparently</sup> semi-conscious & seems indifferent to his condition. Not infrequently, he leaves his room or even his house & <sup>may be</sup> found staggering along the street or lying in the gutter. ~~then~~

but subsequently 101° & occasionally 102°.  
He has continued below from the very first  
occasional attacks of diarrhoea were experienced  
throughout the summer frequently used to take
