A Rare Balsom for y^e palsy 2

Take 2 lb of very strong spirit of sake
 in fusel in it one pound of imperitory
 garyaparila: and castorum of them each
 half an ounce bruse all this a little
 To 2 hand fulls of ordinary Laban
 or flowers Rose mary and sage flowers
 one hand full: steep these ingredients
 in an outhen pitcher: it is well healed in
 y^e infus: stop it with a cork: and bladder
 very close: and keep it in a chimney for
 now: what the day is a constant fyre kept
 if it may be allways Worms: for y^e space
 of fower days and nights: so long y^e pot
 often one worme ombers: shake y^e pot
 twice or thrise a day all y^e while: then
 take 9 drams of Camphier Resolud
 in half a pound of y^e strong of spirit
 of wine: when y^e time is expired of
 on fusel: put y^e pot in a close seller
 to settle y^e spirit: and when y^e foole
 y^e pitcher well cooled then open it
 and stir into it y^e defouled Camphier
 and spirit of wine then pass it
 2 or 3 times through an hipotris
 bag: and keep it in glasses very close
 & stopp'd: this balsum is also good to be used
 to cure y^e spirit: and soe quite y^e if will v^e
 at any tyme if it turn new y^e deal: rub it in till
 it is dry put sum of it in a spoon

A Poultice for a soar Breast
 of sheep head an foot wool and all slit

 then by them up in a sheath and
 let them boyle with y^e sheeps head
 then sum of all y^e fat and sum of
 the liquor y^e head and foot was boyled
 in and put it in a skillet a bout a quart
 then take out the herbs and pour them
 in an wooden dish and put them in
 y^e liquor. then put in sum of insod
 flower or rise flower a litle faorme

A Balsom

Take of Venice Turpentine one pound
 oyle of olives three points yellow wax
 halfe a pound one ounce of Naturall
 balsom one ounce of oyle of St Johns wort
 one ounce of Red Sanders. Finely pow
 derd: six spoonfulls of Sashes put y^e
 wax and melt it, one y^e fyre and then
 for fyre it take fyre: take it of and put
 y^e Turpentine to it. having first waf
 ter y^e Turpentine in dammaske rose
 water. All y^e Turpentine scobotho hits
 having all in gold y^e salt oyle and
 Sashes. put also y^e oyle to them, and
 let them one y^e fyre, and stir them let
 they begin to boyle, if the fyre be illu
 tate, if y^e fyre be milt it wil boyle
 speedly. then suffer it the dole for a
 night or more: until y^e water an wine
 be sunk to y^e bottom then make sum
 holes in y^e stuff: that y^e water may
 run out of it: and pour y^e water clear
 from it with being don solid one y^e
 fyre againe: putting to it the naturall
 Balsom, and y^e oyle of St Johns wort
 any when it is melted put y^e Sanders
 to it, and stir it well wth it may incorpa
 rate it and when it first begin to
 boyle: then take it of, and stir it for
 2 howere or more til it be grown thick
 or quill dole then wil last 30: or 40
 y^e dayes

Take turth all green wounds being
Molled and powdered in y^e wound, and
a litle Lint dipped in som of it and laid
upon y^e wound. It stoneth any bleeding
of y^e nose: or any other parts: if they
stop their noses with sum of it or powder
it in y^e wound: it cures any fistula or
ould Ulcer it cures any inward blow
in y^e kidneys: or any parts of y^e body
or any weathers in y^e Cask: being drank
as Mutt or asponfull: in six spoonfulls
of Red carth. Morning and Evening
for a Month to gether. It cures all
Bruisings inwardly or outwardly

fore in forme. It cures the paine
of the head by Anointing the temples
with som of it. It is good to prevent
one from y^e plague: and small pox. if y^e
one in y^e nose with it. It cures all
ould Ulcers or oods y^e Cask: and swoll-
ings and for the Kings Cask: if y^e they
Moll it and Anoint y^e place with it: it
cures all burns or scalds with fyre
water or gun powder: if y^e you Moll
the Poison and Anoint y^e burn with
it: And dip a white paper in y^e ball
sum And lay it upon the burne

poppy flowers one handfull and halfe
put all this to gether into a glass Close
stopped up if not yett least byr May on
toe into it for the space of three
days at least strain your spirit from
your ingredients And do to it A quarter
of A pint of damaske Rose Water
four loafe sugar halfe a pound
if you please you may take 4 grains
of Ambergreece Musk 2 grains: Con-
fection of Almonds one dram saffron
A scruple put them all in a little sizen
of bag And hang in the glass

Take: two pounde Andifower ounces
of oyle of Olive of y^e best. of good Red
Lead one pound white Lead one pound
well beaten to dust twelue ounces
of spanish soap and interparate
all this together very well in and lye
in pot: well glasted before you put them
to boyle and when they are well in
terparate. that if soap & smeth up
wards. put it upon a small fyre of
coalls continuing the fyre for the
space of An howre and halfe: still
stirring it with an Iron ball one y^e

A Jolly for Consumpison
A Cock y^e is not too old pull him and make
him fit for boyling draw him clean

quarter ounce of grains
quarter ounce of Cloves
three Quarts of salt
three quarts of White wine
Sugar to your taste
halfe a draine of Musk
halfe a draine of Ambergras
If it has Laine in steep
A day or two ^{then} put in 2 quarts of
Mitho mix them to gether and run
them through and Hippocris bag
till it runs clear.

How to preserve Orvings
Take your best bar maces or wigg-
ht. small orvings the thickest & rince
are the best. boyle them in a pot
of Water keeping something
upon them that may all way keep
them vnder water; let them boyle till
they are tender. But not too breake
then pare them as thin as it is possible
then lay them in water shifting your
water often: let you thinke the better
is out of the peell: then take them
out and make little hals with a pen
knife take aw the starker grose: And
put the Curial out with a booke
but none of the Meale if you can
help it: Take the way of Duble refine
suger And Make a syrrop with it: And
let it be as thick as you can And put
in two your Orvings boyle long hot: And
when they be And stand a. or 3. days
take out your orvings and boyle
up your syrrop soe youd let them dry
you must never boyle the orvings
with the syrrop for then they will be
soufe. And if you will hande it fully with
them which will be much better
take John Apple and pare them but
not pare them: but gnaw them and
boyle them in water as long as you
can with out breacking them then
pore them through a cloth: then take
that liquer and put Duble refine

Enger And Boyle it two or thre
But the quantity must be as
my to your distion: then put
every orring in a glass boild
solfe soe youd your selfe upon it

To preserve oranges another
way

Take 12 of y^e fairest & best colored
oranges you can gett cut little holes as y^e
seales & core y^m grate soe y^e outward
ribe wth a grater yⁿ lay y^m in spring
water 2 days shift it often yⁿ boyle
y^m but y^e water must be presy hot befor
you put y^m in let y^m boyle very fast close
covered when the water looke yellow shift
y^m into another skilet of boyling water thus
shift y^m till they be very tender yⁿ take y^m
up & weigh y^m & to every pound of orange
take 4. or 5. and half of loaf suger & to every

round of suger i pint of water put y^e
suger & water into a skillett & chedifie
it with whites of eggs & when it is very clear
scume & straine it into a skillett and
lett it boyle very fast for a quarter of an
houer yⁿ put in y^e oranges & let yⁿ boyle
half an hour close covered & if you have
4 pound of suger you may if you please
put in a pint of white wine ready room
ed lett it boyle a quarter of a hour long
er yⁿ poure on y^m 2 pint of pipper
liquor & soe lett them boyle very fast
till they be nere enough put in the iuyce
of a lemon & boyle it another quarter

Take a pound of cleane venice turpentine
wash it 3 times in half a pint of red rose
water till it be very white yⁿ take 3 pinte
of y^e best salet oyle can be gotten and
half a pound of y^e best liquiable storax
which you must wash in a pint of red
rose water & plantaine water half a pint
of each yⁿ mingle all together & lett y^m
very well yⁿ put y^m on a charcole fire
in a bason with half a pound of new bees
waxe cut in small peeces & lett y^m boyle
a little yⁿ adde to it of bayleaves rosmery
same time & s^t Johns wort of each one
handfull cut y^m before you put y^m in lett
it boyle gently constantly stirring it with a
wooden spatule yⁿ take it of the fire &
lett it coole & when it is cold cast of the
water wch is good for y^e itch or any scabs
then put it on the fire agen & lett it boyle
a little yⁿ straine it through a good strunge

cloth squeezing it hard cast away y^e herbs
you set it on y^e fire again & adde to it

in fine powder 4 ounces red sanders &
y^e best dragons blood both finely powdered
of each 2 ounces sift ye powders very
fine before you put them in which you must
put in by little & little stirring it continual
ly on the fire & let them boyle a little
while then take it off & straine it
twice through a linnen cloth to take
away y^e powders y^e being done set it on
fire again adding to it of y^e best naturall
balsome & spermacite of each 2 ounces
oyle of s^t Johns wort one ounce y^e take
of y^e fire continually stirring till it be
cold soe put it in pots for use

creame of tart or finely beaten & let it stand
on ye fire 4 hours ready to boyle but not
boyle at all ym take ye whites of 14 eggs &
beat ym 2 hours till they come to an oyle
ym let ym stand till ye almond milke is quite
cold ym take of ye froth & put in ye oyle in
to the milke & shake ym soundly together &
put it in into botts for use 2

sore & ye cut ym into peces as big as 5 shillings
& lay on one because it is easier to be taken
off ym in a hole one let it lye on a week &
when you take it off have ready warme water
& sope & rubbe ye hands well with sope ye wash
ye head very well & dry it & lay on ye plaster
cut as ye first which doe till it is well
you will think att ye 2^d dressing it is ye worst

as you can before you lay on ye plaster 2

Take of shalperill & saxafrig wood of each
2 ounces wood of life a quarter of a pound
ounce of saunders a pe of raisons stoned half
a pound of figs boyle all in 6 quarts of water
till it is consumed y^e fowle is hot
on y^e ounce of seena covered to close 24 hours
drink half a pint in ye morning till all is out
you may see a bad way where it is ye best way
for any swamy humour or any y^e hard sores

for any heat or paine in ye head or distraction
coming for want of sleep or grief ^{mis mille}

Take 6 quarts of posit drinke & when you go
to bed drinke as much as you can & as fast till
you bring it up see doe 3 times on after another
