ANNUAL MEETING, 1913.

THE ANNUAL MEETING was held at the Medical Society's Rooms, Chandos Street, on Tuesday, February 25th, at 2.45 p.m.

The Chair was taken by Sir James Moody, Medical Superintendent of the London County Asylum, Cane Hill. The Report and Balance Sheet for 1912 were read by the Secretary. The adoption of the Report was proposed by Sir George Savage and seconded by the Bishop of Croydon.

The re-election of the Council was proposed by Dr. Thomas (East Sussex Asylum, Hellingly) and seconded by Dr. Needham (Commissioner in Lunacy).

A paper was read by Dr. Hubert Bond (Commissioner in Lunacy) on "After Care in Cases of Mental Disorder and the desirability of extending its scope," which was followed by a discussion in which the Bishop of Croydon, Sir James Moody, Dr. Henry Rayner, Dr. Bower, Dr. Lord, Dr. Percy Smith, Mr. Trevor, Dr. Helen Boyle, Miss Humphris and Mr. Roxby took part and to which Dr. Bond replied.

The proceedings terminated with a vote of thanks to the Chairman and to Dr. Bond, proposed by Dr. Macartney and seconded by Dr. Ogilvy (Medical Superintendent of the London County Asylum, Long Grove).

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL.

From January 1st, to December 31st, 1912.

The Council of the After Care Association for Poor Persons discharged recovered from Asylums for the Insane again has pleasure in presenting the Annual Report.

The most important function of the Association is finding suitable occupation for persons, who, although recovered, have often many peculiarities and prejudices. This necessitates the bestowal of an extreme amount of personal care and individual attention upon each case, and the careful investigation of the suitability of those with whom they are placed. The effect of this is far greater than the mere supplying of temporary homes, clothing, or grants for maintenance and tools, important though these may be, and gives full occupation to the staff who are employed in this work. The strongest possible evidence of the utility of this Charity is shown not only in the comfort and aid given, but in the prevention of relapse.

Cases. During the past year applications on behalf of 391 persons were received; of these 250 were women, and 141 were men. Of this number 148 were cases from the London County Asylums, 156 from other County and Borough Asylums, 18 from Mental Hospitals and Licensed Houses, and 69 from other Institutions. Of these 122 had been assisted in various ways during previous years, and 269 were before the Council for the first time.

Although the Income has increased, it is almost entirely owing to the receipt of Legacies, and the result of the Model Market and Café Chantant kindly held by the Guild of Help in October, and therefore fresh subscriptions and donations are urgently needed.

Legacies. During the year the Association has received a further instalment from the Solicitors of the Estate of the late Miss Foveaux amounting to £150 11s. 7d. Notice of a legacy of £1000 has also been received from the Executors of the late Miss E. W. Walker, of which £400 has been paid, the balance to be handed over during 1913.

Canon Skelton, and the speakers were Sir James Crichton-Browne, Dr. Nicolson, the Hon. John Mansfield and Mr. Roxby. (e) At All Saints' Parish Hall, Highgate, by the kind invitation of the Vicar and Mrs. Hawkins, the Rev. F. H. A. Hawkins presiding. The speakers were Sir George Savage, Miss Helen Webb, M.B. and Mr. Roxby. (f) At The Cliff, Warwick, by the kindness of Sir Michael and Lady Lakin, when Lord Leigh presided. Speeches were made by Dr. Rayner, Dr. Miller and Mr. Roxby. (g) At the Council Chamber, Birmingham, the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor (Councillor Ernest Martineau, J.P.) in the chair. The speakers were Councillor Mrs. Pinsent, Councillor David Davis, Dr. Rayner, Dr. Suffern and Mr. Roxby.

Branches were formed as a result of five of these meetings, and an Honorary Local Secretary and Treasurer appointed. After the meeting at Lady Lakin's, a branch was formed for both Warwick and Leamington, but at Sevenoaks one already exists under the able and energetic Secretaryship of Mrs. Courtenay, while at Birmingham negotiations are still going on with regard to the formation of a Branch.

Offertories. The Council is glad to say that it has again received collections from Brentwood, Brookwood, Barnsley Hall, Bromsgrove, Cane Hill, Derby Borough, Netherne, Nottingham City, Wonford House Exeter and Hellingly. The Council heartily thanks the Medical Superintendents and the Chaplains of these Institutions, and also the Rev. W. St. Hill Bourne, the Rev. E. J. Hall, the Rev. G. C. Bell and the Rev. W. P. Hanks, for having Offertories at Finchley, Friern Barnet, Riverhead and St. Peter's, Bayswater, also the Rev. S. R. Buller for a contribution from the Offertory Fund at Weybridge. The Council ventures to think that help of this kind is very useful as it brings the aims of the Association before those who otherwise might not have the opportunity of hearing of its work, and also

A FEW OF THE CASES ASSISTED DURING 1912:—

WOMEN.

- [3435]. A young widow left destitute, with an infant son, was convalesced, outfitted, placed in service and arrangements made for the child to be boarded out in the village where her situation is. Has done well and has kept her place more than a year.
- [3445]. A very respectable but quite friendless young woman, after a time in a Cottage Home, new teeth were provided, some clothing found and a situation accepted for her, where she still is. She has entirely repaid the cost of her clothing and teeth.
- [3451]. A superior young woman, for the first time obliged to earn her own living. After a stay in a Cottage Home she was placed in a confectioner's business and is doing extremely well.
- [3486]. A very hard working elderly widow, very run down for want of food, having been unsuccessful in finding work on her discharge from the Asylum. A local C.O.S. Committee having drawn our attention to the case, she was sent to Hastings for five weeks, and, returning strong and well, obtained work, which she has kept ever since.
- [3562]. A young woman suffering from advanced heart trouble. The Guardians make her a small allowance and the Association now gives her occasional needlework, making necessary garments for other of their cases. She is now enabled to live quite comfortably.
- [3569]. A middle-aged woman of excellent character, who after a long mental illness, spent some time in the Workhouse. From there she was placed as working assistant matron and did well until her employer found her an easier post with some friends of hers.
- [3571]. A young girl with a very sad family history, who after a short stay at Hastings was placed with a kind mistress, who undertook to train her. She writes very happily and is giving satisfaction.
- [3638]. A young girl with no friends and of a very difficult temperament was placed twice and after giving some trouble settled down in her second situation and did well.
- [3650]. A middle-aged woman, who had never had to support herself. A situation was found as useful help, where she now is.
- [3655]. A young woman, who had never settled down to work before and had had a very long mental illness. On her recovery she was sent to a Cottage Home, an outfit provided and a situation found, where she still is and is giving great satisfaction.
- [3690]. A lady of good education. She was boarded out in the country and then in London and found work as a secretary.

MEN.

- [3454]. A middle-aged man, formerly in a good position, mainly through the help of the Association was elected to a home and pension in connection with the trade for which he previously worked.
- [3468]. A printer, who after some temporary help obtained first temporary and then permanent work through our advertisements and his wife assisted to move to the town where he was employed.
- [3515]. A middle-aged man, formerly a bandsman, after being boarded in London for some time obtained an engagement as double bass player. His instrument and some clothing were given. He is still doing well and has nearly repaid the full cost of his double-bass.
- [3527]. A respectable boot-maker was assisted to move and rent paid for three weeks, when he again became self-supporting.
- [3548]. A steady lad, who after keeping one post for three years, broke down, and on his recovery, as his mother was out in service and could not receive him, he was sent to a country Cottage Home, where his health was completely restored.
- [3551]. A very lame man, who after a stay in our Cottage Home at Worthing returned to his friends and obtained work, through his pastor.
- [3558]. A man with a wife and young family to support, relief in kind was given and materials supplied and he was successfully re-started at his old trade of leather dressing.
- [3613]. A respectable man, who after a long mental illness was sent to the Workhouse. He was visited there, clothes given and his friends seen. They consented to receive him, the Association paying for his board, and a berth was found for him in some cement works, where he still is.
- [3645]. A man of superior education, absolutely friendless, after being boarded out in London, he obtained work as a pattern maker. Tools were supplied and clothing given.
