Sir with reference to your letter numbered & date as margin, & in accordance with precedent, I have the honour to forward thro' you to the Director General of the ~~Q. M. S.~~ ^{Q. M. S.} the Manuscript of the first part of a new Catalogue of the preparations in Pathology & Medical Anatomy which are preserved in the Museum of the Department at Melb.

I have further the honour to request that you will submit this M. S. to the Senate of the Army Medical School at its meeting on the 12th of July; and that with the approval of the Senate, the permission of the S. of S. for war be requested to ^{sanction} ~~allow~~ the printing of (say) 500 copies thro' H. M. Printing Stationery Office.

This will be the 3rd printed Edition of the Catalogue; the last edition was printed in 1845 -
