The number of garments made and contributed in 1894-5, amounted to 160, thus making a total of 2,288 garments presented to the Hospital since the formation of the Working Party in 1883.

In addition to this, a sum of £47 has been expended during the last six years in the purchase of Bed Jackets, Dressing Gowns, &c.

The best thanks of the Working Party are due to those ladies who kindly undertook the cutting out.

Contributions of work should be sent *not later than April 30th*. I should feel much obliged if the names and addresses of Honorary Members were placed in the parcels sent, or if a post-card announcing the dispatch of their work were sent to me, as occasionally parcels have arrived without the donor's name, and I have thus been unable to acknowledge the gift.
